# Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) Requirements

Students must review My Pathway Planner and Ontario Student Status sheet to ensure they have completed all the diploma requirements.



## To Graduate:

- **30 credits:**
  - 18 Compulsory Credits and 12 Elective Credits
- **Community Involvement:**
  - 40 hours. If you do NOT have your Community Involvement completed, do so by March 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
- **OSSLT (literacy test):**
  - If you have not passed the test, you should be enrolled in the OLC40 class
- **2 Online Asynchronous Courses**
  - Complete 2 courses or fill out the Opt Out and submit to Guidance
- **34 Credit Threshold:**
  - You may return for a 5<sup>th</sup> year, only if you do not exceed a total of 34 credits in that school year. This also includes Private School courses. Please consult with Guidance as students must get permission to return.

### Compulsory credits are comprised of the following:

- 4** credits in English (1 credit per grade)\*
- 3** credits in Mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
- 2** credits in Science
- 1** credit in Canadian History
- 1** credit in Canadian Geography
- 1** credit in The Arts
- 1** credit in Health and Physical Education
- 1** credit in French as a Second Language
- 0.5** credit in Career Studies
- 0.5** credit in Civics

### In addition, students must complete:

- ☒ 40 hours of community involvement activities
- ☒ the provincial literacy requirement
- ☒ earn at least two credits through Online Learning \*\*\*\*

\* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a Second Language (ESL) or English Literacy Development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

\*\* In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a Second Language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.

\*\*\* A maximum of 2 credits in Cooperative Education can count as compulsory credits.

\*\*\*\* Families who wish to opt out their child from the Online Learning graduation requirement should speak to their child's school.

† The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved Dual Credit courses.

^ Student's achieving an OSSD Red Seal Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) diploma will have additional requirements based on their particular program.

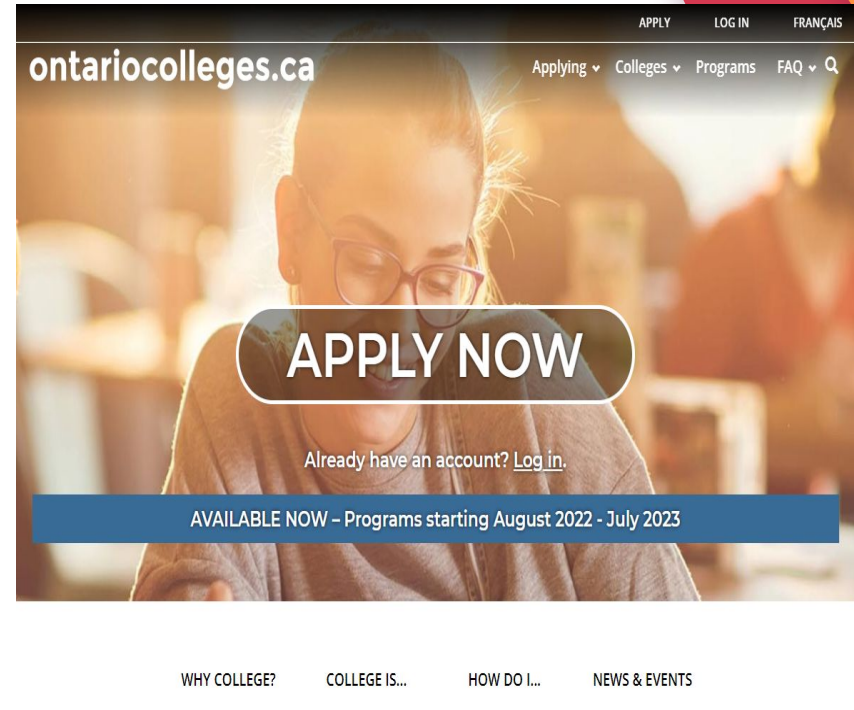
# Reporting to OUAC/OCAS

- OSSD marks are sent at 5 submission times
- Please review marks and credit count on OUAC/OCAS
- **ELL students** - MUST research Language Proficiency Requirements and sign up to write a language test ASAP; Bayview does not submit those results
- **Earning credits outside Bayview:**
  - If you are taking a course offered through YRDSB (i.e. summer/night school; e-learning; International Languages) these will be automatically reported to OUAC/OCAS
  - Any courses NOT offered through YRDSB such as RCM, non-YRDSB International Languages and courses through other school boards, please bring an official transcript/report card to Ms. Chen (Guidance Secretary)
  - **Private School & non-YRDSB** – private schools and other non-YRDSB schools MUST report the course on OUAC/OCAS and MUST submit the mark to OUAC/OCAS. **Bayview will NOT submit the mark.** After the course is completed, the other schools must mail the report card in a sealed envelope
- Schools such as McGill and UBC will pull your marks from OUAC. They will ask for your OUAC application number in your application to their school.

# Researching Ontario Colleges

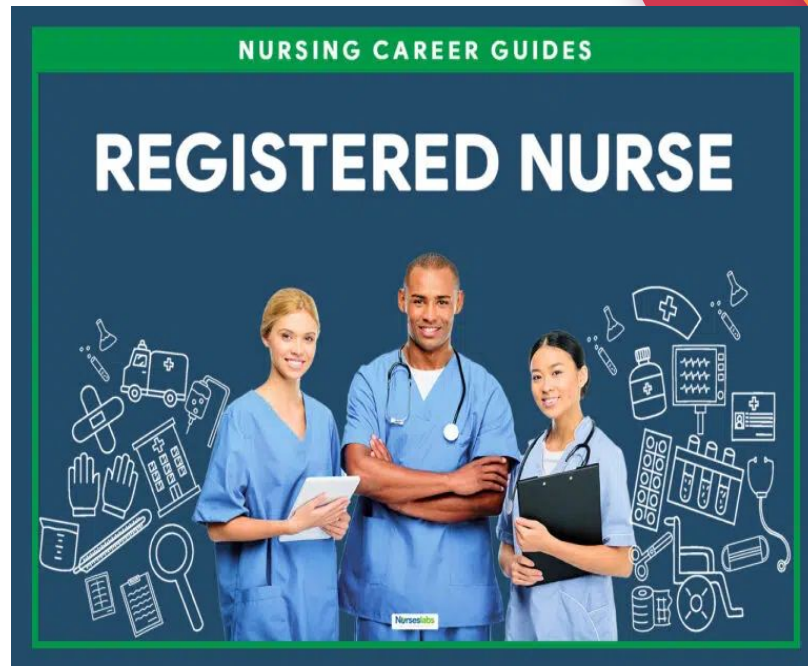
- Ontario colleges use ONE site for both information on schools, programs and to apply: [www.ontariocolleges.ca](http://www.ontariocolleges.ca)
- **Early October 2023: Online Application Opens.**
  - You may create an account and [begin your application](#).
- **November 1, 2023: Earliest Offer Date**
  - This is the earliest date that colleges may begin to send offers of admission to programs. Offers will continue to be issued until programs are filled or wait-lists are established.
- **February 1, 2024: Equal Consideration Date**
  - Apply on or before this date in order to receive equal consideration for admission to programs starting the following fall. After this date, colleges consider applicants on a first-come, first-served basis until programs are full.





# Ontario Colleges - Continued

- Competitive Programs: Note that applications to [Highly Competitive Programs](#) MUST be received by this date in order to be considered. As these programs receive a high volume of applicants, all seats may be filled by February 1.
- Applicants are encouraged to complete their applications well before the Equal Consideration Date, as website volumes on the online application are at their highest at this time.
- Many programs continue to accept applicants after February 1. Use our [Find a Program](#) tool at any time to find programs that are still open.
- **May 1, 2024: Deadline to Confirm Offers of Admission**
- Applicants must confirm their acceptance of an offer of admission by this date. Log in to your [ontariocolleges.ca](#) account to [confirm your offer](#).
- **June 2024: Tuition Deposit Due at the Colleges**

- **Week of October 10:** YRDSB will email students their OEN & school Mident number
- **October 11 2023:** Post-Secondary Fair @ Richmond Green SS from 6:30-8:30pm
- **October 16 2023:** College presentation Period 2 in the library classroom
- **October 19 2023:** College Fair trip downtown
- **November 1 2023:** Earliest date Ontario colleges begin offers
- **November 13, 2023:** Teachers will share mid semester mark updates with graduating students in Grades 11 and 12 courses.
- **Before November 16, 2023:** Potential graduates applying to university that are planning to drop a course and do not wish to have the course mark shared with OUAC must connect with their Guidance Counsellor. (**You need to have 4 courses in day school to drop**).
- **November 17, 2023:** School to submit Semester 1 midterm marks to OUAC
- **November 29, 2023:** This is the **full disclosure date** which is the final day for graduating students, in a grade 11 or 12 course, to drop a course in order that it not be recorded on your transcript.
