## How is a Specialist High Skills Major recognized?

Students who successfully complete a SHSM will receive:

- an OSSD with an embossed SHSM seal
- a SHSM Record documenting their achievement
- formal recognition on their Ontario Student Transcript.


## What is a Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)?

SHSM let students focus on a career path that matches their skills and interests while meeting the requirements of the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). Students complete a bundle of courses and gain valuable work experience through Co-op. SHSM programs lead to all post-secondary pathways university, college, apprenticeship, and the workplace.

At Bayview SS, we offer three SHSM Sectors: Business, Health \& Wellness and Non-Profit. Students can apply to be part of our SHSM program in their Grade 10 year for completion in Grade 11 and 12.

## Courses for SHSM

Before selecting courses review the courses required for the particular sector of interest. All three sectors require 2 credits in co-op. If you cannot fit coop in day school, summer school coop is not guaranteed. Summer school coop also does not provide the same amount of certifications required for SHSM.

## Specialized Programs at Bayview - Cont'd



The Dual Credit program allows Grades 11 \& 12 students intending on applying to college to take college courses that count towards both the OSSD and a college certification, diploma, or degree. Students may earn up to a maximum of four optional credits through college-delivered dual credit courses. Here is a link to the YRDSB Dual Credit info.

Note: This program is for students who are credit deficient. If you are on track to graduate, you do not qualify for this program. Please see your guidance counsellor to discuss eligibility.

"Students may add a maximum of two Online Learning courses to their course selections. Beginning with the cohort of students who entered Grade 9 in the 2020-21 school year, all students must earn a minimum of two online learning credits as part of the graduation requirements for an Ontario Secondary Schoo Diploma unless they have been opted-out or exempted. Up to one secondary school credit completed by Grade 9 students in the 2020-21 school year during the province-wide school closures (from April 2021 to June 2021) may be counted towards this graduation requirement

## Reaching Ahead and Impact

- Students in grades 9-11 CANNOT drop a course unless they have 23 completed credits
- Avoid reaching ahead if you cannot handle the course material.
- Full Disclosure: Grade 11 and 12 courses taken in Grades 9 and 10 will show up on a transcript to college and university.
- Students who reach ahead must understand the course will be given to students in the appropriate grade first if it is oversubscribed. Students are only allowed to choose 2 reach aheads.


## Important Final Items

- Do your RESEARCH. Do not choose what your friends are choosing. It is really hard to change a course during the school year as it is based on availability.
- Courses are not guaranteed. Alternate courses may be used.
- Grade 12 students need to have 3 courses each semester. Students cannot be part time at Bayview regardless of your credit accumulation.
- Guidance will contact students who have an incomplete timetable.
- Students with Grade 7 and/or 8 practical and theory at the Royal Conservatory of Music (RCM) - these credits count as an elective credit only.
- Students can begin submitting courses February 15 @9am to February 23 @3pm
- Grade 12 students not returning MUST submit by January 25 @ 3pm
