
Graduation Indicator

How to register for Bayview's SHSM?

How is a Specialist High Skills Major recognized?

Students who successfully complete a SHSM will receive:

- an OSSD with an embossed SHSM seal
- a SHSM Record documenting their achievement
- formal recognition on their Ontario Student Transcript.

What is a Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)?

SHSM let students focus on a career path that matches their skills and interests while meeting the requirements of the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). Students complete a bundle of courses and gain valuable work experience through Co-op. SHSM programs lead to all post-secondary pathways – university, college, apprenticeship, and the workplace.

At Bayview SS, we offer three SHSM Sectors: **Business**, **Health & Wellness** and **Non-Profit**. Students can apply to be part of our SHSM program in their Grade 10 year for completion in Grade 11 and 12.

Courses for SHSM

Before selecting courses review the courses required for the particular sector of interest. All three sectors require <u>2 credits in co-op</u>. If you cannot fit coop in day school, summer school coop is not guaranteed. Summer school coop also does not provide the same amount of certifications required for SHSM.



- Grade 11's <u>NO</u> alternates required. You can still submit even with the error.

Opt-Out

Students **going into grade 10, 11 and 12** who do not wish to take the online asynchronous day school course must choose the Opt-Out code **OLOPTO**. You must click on the **Online Learning Opt-Out** and a box will pop up to say **Add Course**. IB students going into Grades 11 & 12 must Opt-out. You can take a non-IB asynchronous course in the summer.





Online Day School Asynchronous Courses

Students **going into grade 10, 11 and 12** who **Opt-In** to the online asynchronous day school must choose **ONLINE.**

Click on **ONLINE** and a window will pop up with a list of courses to choose from.

Click onto the course and then click Add Course.



Online Learning Courses

Online Learning Courses



This course is a placeholder for asynchronous Online Learning. When you choose this option, you will be prompted to choose an Online Learning course from a drop-down menu. These courses are delivered entirely online using an asynchronous model; they are not teacher-led classes at a specified time each day. These asynchronous Online Learning courses count towards the Online Learning requirement for students who entered Grade 9 in the 2020-21 school year. Students may add a maximum of two Online Learning courses to their course selections.






"Students may add a maximum of two Online Learning courses to their course selections. Beginning with the cohort of students who entered Grade 9 in the 2020-21 school year, all students must earn a minimum of two online learning credits as part of the graduation requirements for an Ontario Secondary School Diploma unless they have been opted-out or exempted. Up to one secondary school credit completed by Grade 9 students in the 2020-21 school year during the province-wide school closures (from April 2021 to June 2021) may be counted towards this graduation requirement.




Parent/Guardian Approval

Once students submit their courses they are prompted with a **Send Approval Email** option. Once clicked, a parent or guardian's email address can be added.

After entering an email address and clicking **Send Approval Email**, the parent/guardian receives a course selection approval request email, including:

- The student's course requests
- Alternate course requests
- Issues with course submission, if any (e.g. missing prerequisite, etc.)

Important Final Items

- IB students **CANNOT** <u>drop</u> a course because they are not doing well in it
- Students who **reach ahead** must understand the course will be given to students in the appropriate grade first if it is oversubscribed. Students are **only** allowed to choose 2 reach aheads.
- There are no spares in grade 11 and 12 IB
- Gr 9 students CANNOT choose a science course that you intend to take as an IB science course in grade 11 or it will count as a repeat.
- The third science course will be an OSSD credit and is not guaranteed for Grade 10 semester 2. Priority will be given to OSSD Grade 11 students.
- IB Courses in myBlueprint can be found under IB Diploma
- Grade 9 and 10 IB courses end in 'Z'
- **HL** courses end with a 'Z' SBI3UZ
- **SL** courses end with a '**7**' SBI3U7 except the second half of the TOK/French/Spanish combo which ends with a '**Z**'
- Biology Part 3 code SNC4M2

- Courses are not guaranteed. Alternate courses may be used. The IB coordinator will contact you if an alternate course is used.
- Students can begin submitting courses February 15 @9am to February
 23 @3pm
- Grade 11 IBs who do not submit their course selection, Guidance will assume you are not returning to Bayview. You will be demitted.
- Students considering withdrawing from IB must email Ms. Joffe. Do not simply choose OSSD courses without informing the school.
- Grade 12 students MUST submit by January 25 @ 3pm
