Types of Programs at College

- Certificate Program: 1 year of study. Here is the <u>link</u> to a list of certificate programs
- Diploma Programs:
 - Regular Diplomas are 2 years of study. Here is the <u>link</u> to regular diploma programs
 - Advanced Diplomas are 3 years of study. Here is the link to advanced diploma programs
- Bachelor's Degree: 4 years of study offering the best of both worlds: a solid foundation of theoretical knowledge and the practical skills to apply this knowledge in the real world. Here is the <u>link</u> to Bachelor Degree programs.

Types of Programs at College - Cont'd

- Collaborative & Joint Degree Programs: are offered jointly by a college and a partnering university. Students may earn either one or two credentials - one from the college and one from the university. These are hands-on learning with theoretical approach to university studies. - Co-op Programs: include scheduled periods of employment in related industries. Placements are typically paid positions. Here is a list to the co-op programs:

Apprenticeship Programs at Colleges

Apprenticeship Programs:

- enables you to learn a skill trade on the job, under the supervision of an experienced tradesperson. The classroom component of apprenticeship training may be taken through an Ontario college apprenticeship program.
- 75-90% on the job training

How To Apply

- Website: <u>www.ontariocolleges.ca</u>
- Create username and password (keep a record)
- Apply NOW
- You may select up to <u>5</u> choices with no more than <u>3</u>
 program choices at any one college
- Fee is \$125 payable by credit card, online banking, certified cheque or money order (non-refundable)
- You need your **OEN** (Ontario Education Number)
- Only <u>ONE</u> offer of admission can be accepted. You can change your acceptance if you receive a later offer; this will then *cancel* your first offer

Important Dates

- October: Ontario College Application Centre (OCAS) is open so apply NOW
- November 1: Earliest offer date
- November 16: Final day to drop sem 1 course before reporting midterms
- November 17: Midterms submitted to OCAS
- November 29: Full Disclosure
- February 1: Deadline for equal consideration date and earliest admission offer date (applicants may confirm / accept offer given)
- February 1: Earliest date to confirm an offer of admission
- Offers will continue until all programs are filled; you will be contacted directly.
- Note that applications to Highly Competitive Programs must be received before Feb 1 in order to be considered as all seats may be filled by Feb 1.
- Late April: mid-term marks to OCAS
- May 1: Deadline to confirm offers of admission
- June: Tuition deposit due at the colleges. Each college has its own set dates.
- July: early July final transcript sent to OCAS

You Are Responsible For

- Verifying your academic information is accurate (your school, courses and marks)
- Arranging assessment dates with the colleges regarding placement tests and portfolios
- Submitting any required documents, such as IEP document or language proficiency document
- Informing Bayview SS and OCAS of any changes to personal information
- Each college will have a Portal you must set-up an account

You Are Responsible For - Cont'd

- Private School courses are sent <u>by</u> the private school
- Students must ask International Languages at other school boards to add the course on OCAS
- Provide <u>personal</u> email address (not gapps)
- Making sure OCAS receives your acceptance by the due date; there are no extensions

Accepting An Offer

- To accept an offer of admission to college, log in to your www.ontariocolleges.ca account.
- Click on View Offers to see your offers of admission.
- Select the offer of admission you wish to accept.
- Click Confirm.
- Once you have accepted an offer, <u>ontario colleges</u> will send a confirmation email
- The other colleges to which you have applied will receive notification of your accepted offer.
- You may <u>not defer</u> an offer of admission.
- Deadline May 1

Changing Your Confirmation of Acceptance

- You may receive more than one offer of admission
- You may accept only one offer at a time. However, if you change your mind or receive another offer that you prefer, you may change your acceptance as long as the offer has not expired. Your current acceptance will automatically cancel your previous acceptance.
- Note that you may only confirm an offer once per day.

Confirmation Deadlines

 You must confirm your acceptance to college by May 1, unless the offer was made to you after this date. Each college determines its own confirmation deadline on offers made after May 1.

Financing Your Education

- College costs on average \$3,000.00+ (tuition, books and supplies)
- Living expenses \$9,000.00 to \$12,000.00 if away (apartment, food, clothing, transportation & utilities)
