Community Involvement During Pandemic

The following opportunities will be considered eligible for the **2020-2021 school year;** at the principal's discretion, schools may waive the restrictions that do not allow students to earn hours:

- During the time allotted for the instructional program on a school day; or
- For duties normally performed in the home (e.g., walking a younger sibling to/from school, helping younger siblings with school work).
- Students aged 14 years and older can count up to a maximum of 10 hours from paid employment towards their earned hours.
- Students counting paid employment towards their graduation requirement will be required to complete a reflection exercise indicating how their work contributed to the service for others.
- All questions should be directed to your Guidance Counsellor

Pre-approval Process:

Students who need approval for a volunteer opportunity can email their alpha counsellor. Make sure to include the name of the organization, the supervisor name and phone number in the email.

Submitting Hours:

Students fill out the Community Involvement form, scan the <u>form</u> and email the scanned form to your guidance counsellor. Students can use their smartphones to scan the form.




