First time we've had results in several years due to Covid. This was a digital test where in the past it was on paper.

York Region results (students who are achieving level 3 or level 4 – provincial standards) 71% Math 79% Reading 73% Writing

MJPS Primary Assessment Grade 3 results (only take Math because they are not instructed in English) 74% Math N/D Reading N/D Writing

BAPS Junior Assessment Grade 6 results 79% Math 96% Reading 95% Writing

There is some work to do based on the results so that we can meet the needs of our learners. Families will receive individual results for their students.

Also reported on the students' perceptions about Math, Reading and Writing, which are positive overall.

3. Teacher Rep Report

So nice to have a busy and active school again!

- The grade 8s went on a Field Trip to McMichael Art Gallery. There, they took a guided tour of the gallery and saw works by the Group of Seven and others, and they participated in interactive lessons around the Elements of Art and Principles of Design. Students also participated in a painting workshop and created amazing watercolour landscape paintings to bring home. The students thoroughly enjoyed the trip and did a great job of representing BAPS.
- The Games Club has been running for Grades 5 and 6. Students enjoy playing board games and card games. It gives them the chance to interact in small groups outside of the classroom. They are loving Games Club!
- Grade 4 and 5 Art Club also takes place once per week. Each week, students get to participate in a Healthy Schools committee initiative SNACK (BINGO). Last week, each homeroom had a BINGO board with healthy snacks on it. Each morning on the announcements, the announcers read some fun facts about healthy foods and named two healthy snacks for classes to cross off on their boards. Students listened eagerly to hear each morning. The winning class was Ms. Zaretsky's class. They were very excited to win a free period.
- Eco Club: They have put GOOS (good on one side) paper bins in each class. The Junior students are learning about Water Warriors.
- Character Matters The character trait for November was Kindness. December's trait is Responsibility. Teachers have received some resources and strategies to teach character in class and there are posters and announcements in the school to support positive character development. We will have a Character assembly next week where certain students will be recognized for their outstanding efforts in these areas.
- Intermediate volleyball: Both girls and boys teams did very well. The boys placed 3rd in the region.
- Junior Volleyball Grade 5-6 has started up.
- The Holiday Concert is taking place this Thursday.
- Grade 4, Grade 5, Grade 6 classes, Glee Club, Guitar/Ukulele club, Grade 4-5 music club will be participating. There will be a day and an evening show.
- Richmond Hill Community Food Bank over 1000 items were donated and the food bank reached out to express their tremendous gratitude for our support. They are extremely appreciative.
- 30 Grade 7-8 students helped out the evening and morning of Student-Led conferences. They demonstrated responsibility, kindness and leadership skills to support our staff and families.
- Clothing Drive We had an overwhelmingly positive response to this initiative. Families donated many items of winter clothing to support families in our York Region community. Grade 7 and 8 helpers worked tirelessly to sort and fold the donated clothing and really wanted to do their best to help out.





- Spirit Days: Fridays in December are Pyjama Days. Next week is a spirit week. Intermediate leadership committee is planning the daily themes. There are announcements and posters to communicate with staff and students. Details will be sent in the Blizzard to help families plan.

- 4. Budget Meeting recap

We will have approximately \$10,000 in revenue from pizza sales in addition to \$1000 leftover from last year.

We allocate funds to:

Does not include money for technology. The cost sharing program to help purchase technology is on pause for now.

There is a PRO Grant program to get funding up to \$800 for parent engagement.

Voula says 2 students came forward with a motivational speaker from TED Talk that they would like to have come to the school. Could be possible to use PRO Grant if it is parent focused.
