The Forest of Reading® is a Canada-wide reading program! This program aims to encourage a genuine and life-long love of reading among readers of all ages and helps celebrate Canadian books, publishers, authors and illustrators. More than 270,000 readers participate annually!

As a bilingual book club, students will have access to books in French and English from a variety of genres. There are 10 nominated books in each category and students will read at least five of the ten titles to be eligible to vote in April. Votes are counted from across Canada to determine the winners. We aim to celebrate the winning authors at the Forest of Reading Festival in May, where students can meet authors and illustrators, attend workshops and meet readers from across the GTA.
