| Use of School Generated Funds | Sofia Papadatos and Vicky Ho-Antipas provided an overview of school-generated funds through fundraisers and lunch programs. These are funds that are run by the School Council and administered by the principal. <br> - Unacceptable Use: Items paid for through grants, facility maintenance and repairs, core instructional materials. |

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| Fundraising Update \& Financial Report | August 31, 2023 Update: <br> - Fun fair raised $\$ 855$ in revenues. The spring fun fair is more of a community building event than a fundraising one. <br> - We generated approximately $\$ 63,000$ last year in revenues and $\$ 21,178$ was available for spending as of August, 2023. <br> September, 2023 Updates: <br> - Opening Balance: $\$ 22,531.42$ <br> - Revenues coming from Pizza, Swiss Chalet and Subway. <br> - Net Revenue: $\$ 21,200.00$ from Pizza lunches; $\$ 4,200.00$ from subway lunches; $\$ 5,500.00$ from Swiss Chalet. <br> - Total available for spending for term one is $\$ 48,677.12$. <br> Current Fundraising Efforts in Effect: <br> - Monday and Tuesday: The Lunch Lady (\$1/meal is donated to the school) <br> - Wednesday: Subway lunches - 183 orders. <br> - Thursday: Pizza Nova - 372 Orders; 507 Slices <br> - Friday: Swiss Chalet - 303 students. <br> Open to other ideas as long as it meets ministry health guidelines. <br> Other Fundraisers: <br> - Terra Cotta Cookie Dough Fundraiser will run again this year. Fundraising money will go towards grade 8 graduation. <br> - Popcorn will be sold 3 days a week. Proceeds also go to grade 8 graduation |
