1) Principal's report and Teacher's report:

Instructional

- Guidance Assemblies met with all grades. Grade 12's met in smaller groups to talk about post high school options. Grade 11 options with courses M, U, O. Grade 10 transition to higher grades and course selection. Grade 9 making transition from elementary school successful.
- Interim Reports went out already.
- OSSLT Practice Test Oct 19 modified practice test. "Scan tron" version so it was easier to mark. Teachers will mark and group the students into 3 levels to give assistance where necessary
- Parent's Night Sept 28th . Successful.

Events/Activities

- Terry Fox run assembly on Terry Fox Legacy. Then a school walk and picture of entire student body in letter formation. The leadership class coordinated it and it was very well put together. A great success.
- Women In Sport Symposium Sr Girls prep basketball. Honouring Women in Sport and a fundraiser for this team. Great turn out and successful evening.
- New Student Information Nights held Oct 3 and 12. Slightly different in 2 nights vs 3 and in 2 locations within the school plus a tour. Presentation was given by the school administration and another presentation given by guidance and the strength training teacher. Applications are now open for the 2018/19 school year.
