# ONTARIO COLLEGE REQUIREMENTS

- All Ontario Colleges require Grade 12 English qualification (ENG4C1 or ENG4U1) + other required courses by each college/program
- College programs often have additional requirements (i.e. portfolio, interview, written tests, etc)
- Most colleges treat C, U, and M courses equally.
- Highly competitive college programs often have cut-off averages
- Fee: \$95 for 5 program choices
- Feb 1 deadline for equal consideration

- 6 courses with 4U or 4M codes, including ENG4U1
- Courses listed as “required” for each program of interest
- Calculation of admission average to meet the cut-off will include required courses + next highest marks for a total of 6.
- Deadline to apply: **January 17, 2017**
- Fee to apply: \$150 for 3 program choices  
\$50 for each extra program choice

# Applying to University

## Complete the 101 online application if you meet all of the following requirements:

- You are taking courses during the day at an Ontario high school (this includes students returning for second semester and graduated students returning to upgrade 1 or more courses).
- You have not, at some point, been out of high school for more than seven consecutive months.
- You will have received or expect to receive your Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) with six 4U/M courses at the end of the current year.
- You have not attended a postsecondary institution (college/university/career college).
- You are applying to the first year of an undergraduate degree program or diploma program at an Ontario university.

Contact your guidance counsellor or the [OUAC](#) if you do not satisfy **all** of the previous criteria.

The 101 application deadline has now passed.

You may log in to your 101 account to review and change your application information and to review and respond to university offers of admission.

**Note:** Applications received after the deadline will still be processed by the OUAC and distributed to the universities; however, specific university deadlines will apply.

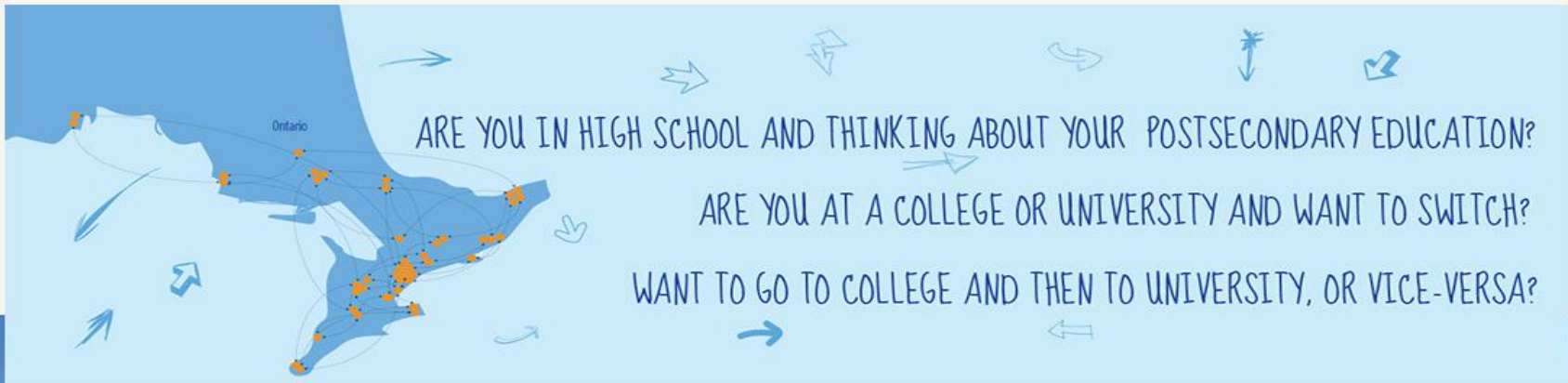

# APPRENTICESHIPS

- There will be a critical labour shortage in the skilled trades over the next few years.
- Apprenticeship programs allow students to earn pay while they learn
- Theory courses involved
- Often pre-requisite courses involved
- An apprenticeship program allows access to well-paid highly skilled careers.
- OYAP available in school through Co-op

# RELEASE OF INFO TO OUAC/OCAS

In order to ensure that your information is available to the college and university application centres, there will be a one-time release of grades for all students in Grade 12, using secure transmission technology, in October to the Ontario College Application Service, and in November to the Ontario University Application Centre in support and in anticipation of all post secondary applications. If you would like more information about this please contact your assigned guidance counsellor.

# Transmission of Marks

- November – general info goes to OUAC/OCAS and gr 11 marks
- Feb – 1<sup>st</sup> semester finals marks
- April - 2<sup>nd</sup> semester mid-term marks
- May 29 – latest date to receive a response from an Ontario university
- June 1 – Universities may require a response
- July- finals and OSSD completion

Offers of admission – CONDITIONAL

# OUT OF PROVINCE SCHOOLS

- Contact the school directly for an application or apply on-line
- Often a cost per school to apply
- Check each school's program for specific out-of-province requirements
- Deadlines can be different from Ontario schools
- OUAC will transmit (if you request) to some out-of province universities (i.e. UBC, Dalhousie, McGill....)

# U.S. SCHOOLS

- Contact school directly for an application or do it on-line.
- Cost involved to apply to each school.
- Terminology: Universities are called Colleges. Colleges are called 2-yr colleges
- SAT or ACT usually involved
- GPA calculation of marks from gr. 9 -12
- NCAA eligibility – 16 core courses (Division I and II schools) to play
- University Admission criteria is separate from NCAA eligibility
- See your guidance counsellor
