### Works in Progress...

"Just be patient with me; I'm a work in progress" Alan Jackson

We are coming up to the time of the school year where students and parents will receive their first formal reporting on student learning for this school year. At school (and at home) teachers are working on the progress reports that will be sent home later this month to share with families and let them know how our learners have adapted to the start of the school year. Along with the preparation of these formal reports, teachers and students are also working in their classroom to ensure that each student is able to speak to their learning and accomplishments; so far.

We emphasize *so far* because it is the key point of this reflection. The progress report represents a summary of how each student has started the school year and the manner in which they have responded to the learning expectations of their current grade and class. The report is designed to confirm the areas of strength and inform parents (and students) of any areas of concern. Though some information is provided on progress related to the curriculum expectations; this is not the focus of, or main rationale for, the progress report. The learning skills are the focus of the progress report. This is why they are featured prominently on the front of the report form and why there is more space allotted for teachers to comment in this area. There are 6 <u>learning skills</u> featured in our curriculum documents and they are consistent across the grades (from grade 1 to grade 12).

As important as the content of the curriculum is, it really only represents knowledge and information. We know that knowing things is important; but it's how we use and apply our knowledge that ultimately defines our success. It's helpful to know that parents can be a great support in helping their children develop their learning skills- we don't have to be experts about a curriculum subject area to help our children learn how to be responsible, independent or organized. As you read your child's progress report, we hope you will recognize the importance of learning skills and how we can work together to help them develop these skills.
