Student Drop off & Pick up...we know that many parents have opted not to use the bus and will be driving their children to and from school this year. In order to ensure a safe and orderly drop off and pick up period we have cleared the western half of our parking lot (closest to the baseball diamond) of all vehicles and designated it as our Safe Drop Off Zone. We expect that vehicles will enter and exit in a safe and orderly manner respecting one another as well as the staff and children who will be in this area. Please note to help ensure safe entry and physical distancing we ask that students arrive at 9:00 am or later and enter the building as soon as they arrive. We have adapted our safe arrival and attendance procedures so that students who may arrive after our 9:10 entry bell are not marked as late or absent. At the end of the day, staff will supervise our dismissal process to ensure students are physically distanced and safely make it to the vehicle that is picking them up. *Please do not use the bus loop at the front of the school to drop off or pick up students at the beginning and end of the school day.*

EDSBY. All schools in the YRDSB now use a secure online parent communication and engagement platform called EDSBY. EDSBY is also used to manage student attendance- parents who have activated their account can even enter their child's absence using the EDSBY app (which means no more phone calls to report an absence). Parents who have activated their EDSBY accounts can log in on **Wednesday, Sept. 9th** to confirm their child's homeroom teacher and class placement.
