		Re-organization  There was an elimination of the Grade 3 and Grade 4 class. This caused a movement in Grade 2 & Grade 3 to keep balance. A total of 37/38 students were moved, and the staff has done their best to make the transition an easy one.  One kindergarten class was capped at 15 students due to only one educator.  Now starting on Monday September 30 <sup>th</sup> , DECE will be present so now we are able to exceed 15 students for that class.

#### Construction

Construction of the 2 kindergarten classes will be completed after the winter break with work taking place outside of school hours. They are currently on schedule.

There is a hiccup with regards to the new tarmac as it is not level. The fix needs to be done prior to winter this year.

## **Safety Week**
