#### 2020 -2021 Classes



### Message From Our Trustee

Dear Families,



I hope that you and your loved ones are keeping well and are healthy. The past few months have been full of change and uncertainty as we respond to the global pandemic and try to reduce the spread of COVID-19. As a Board of Trustees, we know that our families have experienced this pandemic and the school closures in different ways, and we want you to know that our thoughts have been with you all.

Our school board moved quickly to introduce our <u>Learning and Caring Plan</u> through an intentionally phased approach. Our plan focused on both supporting student well-being and providing continuation of learning for more than 127,000 students. A plan was developed that respected each family's unique situations and focused on maintaining a caring, safe and inclusive learning environment. To support this, over 20,000 pieces of technology were distributed to ensure that all of our students could access the learning opportunities available to them, and resources and plans were put in place to support all of our learners, including students with special education needs and English language learners.

We are all part of a larger community and I am inspired to see the many different ways schools, families and students maintained their connections with one another. It was also moving to see the many inspiring ways our school board, students, staff and families acknowledged our frontline workers and made contributions to the fight against COVID-19. As a school board, for example, we <u>donated over 145,000 pieces of personal protective equipment</u>, including gloves, masks and more.

Each and every one of us has made a difference - in staying home as much as possible and following <u>public health</u> <u>guidelines</u>. I know that this has meant making sacrifices.

To our graduating class of 2020, I know this is not the graduating year you had hoped for. I appreciate that the school closures will not affect your ability to graduate, however this unique situation and the need to postpone graduations has been disappointing. I remain tremendously proud of all of our graduates and look forward to celebrating this important milestone with you as soon as we are able to reschedule the graduation ceremonies.

In addition, I know that you have missed out on field trips, awards events, athletic banquets, spirit days, assemblies, our annual <u>Celebrating Student Success awards</u> and the many other ways we extend learning, connect as a community and celebrate the achievements of our students.

We have also been unable to gather together as we normally would in our schools and communities to celebrate or recognize important dates, including Sikh Heritage Month, Pesach, Good Friday, Easter (Western), Vaisakhi, Holy Friday, Orthodox Easter (Eastern), Ridvan, Jewish Heritage Month, Asian/South Asian Heritage Month, Ramadan, Pride, National Indigenous History Month, Italian Heritage Month and Portuguese Heritage Month. As a Board, these dates of significance are important for us to acknowledge and we will continue to celebrate and value the wealth of diversity in our community.

As the school year comes to a close, I want to wish you and your families a safe, healthy and happy summer. I look forward to a time when we can welcome your children back into our schools again. We know that families have questions about what the return to school will look like. We will continue to share information with you as it becomes available. In the meantime, we encourage you to continue following public health guidelines and to stay connected.

## Communications for Kindergarten and School Registration Spring 2020

### **Kindergarten Registration**

While schools may not be open, families can still register for Kindergarten. Our school, along with all elementary schools in the Board, is now offering online registration. Families can access the online Kindergarten registration information at <a href="http://bit.ly/KindergartenYRDSB">http://bit.ly/KindergartenYRDSB</a>.

Please note: A laptop or desktop computer is strongly recommended to complete the online registration, rather than a mobile device.

Alternatively, families can also complete the elementary school registration form and email it directly to the school. Once schools re-open, families will need to bring in their documents (e.g., birth certificates) for verification.

### **School Registration (Grades 1-12)**

Families new to York Region District School Board registering a student in Grades 1-12 can submit the registration forms via email.

- 1. If you are required to register through the Reception Centre, please send a completed elementary or secondary school registration form to <a href="mailto:reception.centre@yrdsb.ca">reception.centre@yrdsb.ca</a>. Families can contact the Reception Centre directly with questions or if additional support is required.
- 2. Families who do not need to register through the Reception Centre can send a completed elementary or secondary student school registration form to their school email address. Use the school locator tool to identify your home school. School email addresses are available on the school websites.

We look forward to welcoming our new students and families to our school. Families are welcome to send questions regarding registration to the school's email address found on schools' website.

## International and Indigenous Languages Fall Registration

#### **Elementary School Programs**

Students in Senior Kindergarten to Grade 8 can learn to read, write and speak a new language or maintain their heritage language. More than 20 different language courses are available. Registration for the 2020-2021 school year will begin in early July 2020. For locations, times and dates, please see the list of <u>Elementary</u> courses.

Research shows that speaking more than one language has many cognitive benefits and may:

- improve how the brain functions such as improving memory and concentration
- enhance decision-making and multi-tasking skills
- open future employment opportunities

Please check our <u>website</u> in July for the most up to date information on registration and program delivery. Due to space limitations, registration will take place on a first come first served basis.

#### **Secondary School Credit Programs**

The Credit International and Indigenous Languages program, offering 15 different languages, is available to students from Grades 9 to 12. Registration is now open for the <u>upcoming 2020-2021 school course</u> <u>offerings</u>, and closes on September 9, 2020.

#### Did you know there are many benefits to taking credit language courses?

Students can take one International Languages Course as a Group 1- Compulsory or as an Elective Credit towards their Ontario Secondary Diploma. Students can also earn up to three credits towards graduation. If students successfully complete the Level D - University course, it can be used as one of their top six (6) marks for post-secondary entry.

## NEWS FROM MS. JOKINEN, MS. YANG and MS. ORMSON


Hello Kindergarten Families,

Although Ms. Spatafora and her Grade 2 students have missed being back at school in their regular classroom, they have made the best of their new learning opportunities and have quickly adjusted to the online Google classroom model. The Grade 2's have been motivated, engaged learners working consistently to finish their weekly lessons in Language Math, Science, Social Studies, Drama, Music, Visual Arts and Wellness/Health. The students have learned a lot and have definitely added to their repertoire of skills which they can carry over into the next year of learning.

To kick off each month, the class has been setting goals to work together as a team at home and online. They have enjoyed connecting together and well-wishing each other for birthdays when they came up. They have expressed their thoughts on various questions such as Earth day, Health/ Wellness and our weekly lesson. They have participated in many kinesthetic and physically active activities in Health/ Wellness activities posted by Ms. Romanese and Ms. Pedota and demonstrated their learning by uploading their entertaining pictures and videos.

Ms. Spatafora has integrated their subjects to maximize their learning and the activities have been varied and creative. In Language, for example, they started with singing and exploring a spring poem that developed into creating their own cinquain poem which they illustrated. Many of the students honored their mothers by making a creative notebook with unique messages showing their appreciation for their special mothers, grandmothers and aunts in their lives. They also showed their appreciation by writing a "Thank you" letter to their Moms and will soon do the same for their special fathers, grandfathers and uncles for Father's Day. In Media, the students have explored the differences between a commercial/ television program and an ad/ a brand. They learned to reflect more critically on the message they receive from the various media they watch and use each day.

We have integrated our learning in subjects like Language and Science. First, the students learned about Fiction vs Nonfiction using a Venn diagram and identified the features of Non-Fiction Texts. Then, they used various online resources such as Pebble Go and Epic website to read various Non-Fiction Text. After that, they learned about animal groups and habitats, adaptations and animal characteristics. Finally, they will complete an independent animal project where they will write a report on what they learned about their chosen animals and apply their accumulated learning.

In Math, they have continued to explore various topics such as Symmetry, Transformations, Positional/ Location Words, Area/Perimeter, Fractions and recently, they have explored 3D Geometry which has culminated in building their dream house that they hope to live in the future. The students have explored various online apps and games that have made learning fun and engaging. The students have continued to use these opportunities to develop and supplement their lessons and develop their skills in Language, Math, Art, etc.

In Music, they have learned the elements of music such as rhythm, beat, instrumentation (timbre) and pitch. They have made their own instruments which they used to perform their rhythm patterns and they have also created their own rhythm patterns. They have noticed how math and music go together and influence each other.

In Drama, the Grade 2's have been exploring dramatic play through a variety of activities. They were asked to find ordinary objects around the house and use their imagination to give them a new purpose. Some of the things students imagined household items to be were: a bucket as a bathtub, a table tennis race as a frying pan, a banana as a phone and many more. Your child can continue developing their imagination at home by thinking outside the box with ordinary things they have at home. (Ms. Pedota)

The Grade 2's have been busy exploring the world in Social Studies. We have visited new continents, countries, and landmarks, and we have appreciated the beauty and differences that exist in our world. (Ms. Romanese)



### MS. KOHLI'S GRADE 5 CLASS

#### 5K All the Way!

Dear Parent(s) and Student(s):

Happy June! First of all, thank you to my students and parents for their support throughout the school year. It has been an honour to teach your children and collectively, we have all learned a lot from each other.

In 5K, students have engaged in a variety of learning opportunities in the online classroom: In Literacy this past month, students continued their reading strategies of finding important details, summarizing, inferencing; and exploring elements of plot in their narrative myth writing activities; along with engaging in listening activities, oral reflections and responses to weekly questions relating to a variety of activities. Students in 5K surprised their moms with an online cookbook for Mother's Day where each student contributed a recipe that reinforced procedural writing and measurement skills.

In Math, students continued to apply their understanding of the three part lessons (Minds On/Action and Consolidation) in various strands; such as: Measurement (area and perimeter), Patterning and Algebra, and are ending the year with Data Management and Probability.

In Science, students integrated media and continued their learning with activities related to Energy (some even demonstrated their learning by uploading their pictures and videos of their future energy efficient homes), Forces and Structures (e.g. examining their choice of a bridge).

In Social Studies, we continued our learning of Indigenous Peoples and First Contact with Europeans through individual and partner inquiry/research. Other areas of the curriculum were also integrated as students engaged in weekly Inclusion/Wellness activities, DPA, Health (e.g. short and long term effects of Alcohol and support resources), Dance activities, assignments and reflections to various styles and forms (e.g. Bollywood dancing for South Asian month) and Physical Education activities (e.g. skipping, bike riding, dribbling, frisbee, and track and field skills). Students also engaged in a variety of fun optional games, quizzes, enrichment opportunities, extra practice, access to online apps/websites, riddles, jokes and interactive activities (e.g. in Visual Arts continuing their exploration of artists and styles of art).

I am so proud of the perseverance, initiative and patience shown by all my students during such unprecedented times. No one could have predicted in September that we would be completing our year online. This was a huge learning curve for everyone but we are all the better for it. While there is no replacement for face-to-face learning in the physical classroom and social interaction of a regular school day, we have all done our best to encourage and support our children in this new "normal" as a community and we have pulled through! I am grateful to each and every parent and student for their respect, support and appreciation of my efforts to provide a quality, balanced and inclusive program online and throughout the year. Your support and gratitude allowed me to do my job effectively and the positive spirit many of you have shown is appreciated.

Remember 5K students: "Every day and every way, you are getting cooperative, healthier, stronger, more organized, more more compassionate. better math and language skills, more humorous ...and of course, more good looking all the way!" Thank you for the honour of teaching you. I hope you never forget 2020! 

### MAY IN GRADE 6/7 MS. SMITH CLASS

The month of May started with Children's Mental Health Awareness Week. Students in 6/7A took this opportunity to learn about Mental Health and the impact on children in Canada by making infographics. An **infographic** is a collection of imagery, charts, and minimal text that gives an easy-to-understand overview of a topic.







May also brought new book clubs. Students, in groups, read chapters then met with their group members weekly to discuss the past week's readings. Students were able to make text-to-text, text-to-text, and text-to-world connections with the support of their peers. Recently, they have also had an opportunity to use Google Meet to present their ideas about the reading, from visualizations, to character autopsies, to story arcs. This sharing of ideas before turning them in gave students opportunities to listen to their peers suggestions, make some corrections before handing in a final copy.

Finally, the use of a virtual classroom for writing has allowed students to access valuable tools to assist them in the writing process for narratives with a click of the mouse. Each tool is easily accessible for students when they need it.

### **First Day Procedures**

For all students in Grades JK-8 school starts on **Tuesday, September 8th, 2020**. As you and your child arrive outside in the schoolyard, please approach a teacher wearing an orange vest who will direct you to your child's new teacher and their assigned entry/exit door for the 2019—2020 school year.

Signs will be posted at the doors to indicate which classes use that particular door. Teachers will be gathered around their doors to assist students and parents. After the teachers have organized their classes outside their entry doors, the students will be brought to their classrooms.

The first day is a regular school day for all students in Senior Kindergarten to Grade 8, consisting of a **30-minute** morning recess, a **60-minute lunch period** from **12:45-1:45 p.m.**, and a **3:25 p.m.** dismissal.

In conjunction with York Region District School Board's supported entry procedures, <u>Junior Kindergarten</u> students will only attend class for 100 minutes on their first day of school. Letters will be sent home in late June to families of all Junior Kindergarten students regarding the specific time of day their child is to attend school.

Please see a teacher wearing an orange vest if you need help. In case of rain there will be an announcement made with an alternative plan.

### **Student Busing Eligibility**

Dear Parents/Guardians,

### Re: Student Bussing Eligibility

Did you know that students' bussing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son's/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

- All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All YRDSB students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

### **School Council News**


