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


Principal's Message

Our EQAO Results

Our recent EQAO results show that we have some strengths and areas of growth. We have shown a strength in the areas of reading and writing. In these areas, we have either exceeded or are comparable to the results of the province. Our scores in math, while they exceed the results of the province, show that there is room to improve. The percentages that you see reflect the amount of students that achieved (level 3) or exceeded (level 4) the provincial standard.

On our recent P.A. Day, we began to analyze our EQAO and report card data. The purpose of this activity is to determine areas of strength and areas in need of growth. Our next task is to determine what actions we will engage in to address our needs. This will be informed by our Board Improvement Plan for Student Achievement (BIPSA). This plan outlines different actions that the system (i.e.,



board), schools, and classroom can employ to support greater student achievement.

One of these important actions is to Implement a Comprehensive Math Program reflective of the interconnectedness of the Environment, the Learners and the Learning. The "Environment" refers to efforts to create a safe and collaborative classroom environment. "Learners" refers to our goal of students to be confident **problem solvers** who use mathematical knowledge, skills and processes. Finally, "Learning" refers to our work to actively engage students in mathematics in order to support them to construct understanding. This learning should be linked to curriculum expectations, develop communication skills, build confidence and a positive attitude towards math, and offer students the opportunity to learn math independently, in small groups, or whole groups. We will keep you updated in our work to support our students in mathematics.

Internet Safety



As young people embrace the Internet and other mobile communication technologies, bullying has manifested itself in a new and potentially more dangerous way –through cyber bullying. Cyber bullying can generally be defined as sending or posting harmful or malicious messages or images through e-mail, instant messages, cell phones and websites. It is emerging as one of the more challenging issues facing educators, since it has a direct impact on students but often occurs away from school property.

Suggestions for Parents

- Make sure your children understand how vast and public the Internet is. Remind them that anything they post or send in a message is virtually available to be seen or read by anyone in the world.
- Talk to your children about cyber bullying. Make sure they understand what it is. Let then know that cyber bullying is no less serious and unacceptable than other forms of bullying.
- Set up the family computer in an open, common area so that you can monitor what your child is sending and receiving.
- Inform your Internet Service Provider (ISP) or cell phone service provider of any abuse. Although it can take a lot of time and effort to get Providers to respond and deal with your complaints about cyber bullying, it is necessary in order to try to stop it from re-occurring.
- Purchase software that can help track activity. There are parental controls that filter both Instant Messaging and chat rooms.

School Bus Cancellation Notice

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Since some busing schedules begin by 7:00 a.m., cancellation decisions must be made by 6:00 a.m. to allow time to communicate this message to bus drivers. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

Please note the following;

- A decision to cancel school bus service will be region-wide meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate.
- When bus service is cancelled all school tests and/or examinations will be cancelled and rescheduled.
- Student trips involving the use of school buses will also be cancelled.
- School bus routes may be cancelled when severe weather may not be affecting all municipalities in York Region. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional educational programs. Students attending these programs are transported over large attendance areas encompassing several municipal boundaries. This limits the ability to cancel bus service using a municipality or zone methodology.

Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements to transport their children to and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast provides children with energy and essential nutrients, including iron, calcium and vitamins B and C, which are necessary for growth, development and good health. Children who have eaten breakfast can concentrate better and have a longer attention span, helping them to learn and study better. They can also perform better physically after eating breakfast as there is more energy available to their muscles. Breakfast can improve behaviour and mood, as children have better concentration and aren't tired or hungry.

As a healthy school, we support our children's health by providing a grab and go breakfast program. This includes a variety of healthy items (e.g., muffins, tangerine, carrots, cucumber...). I would like to **thank** our breakfast club team for their work in organizing, giving out, and monitoring this initiative!



Please call the office for every student absence and/or late. This may include illness, appointments, personal reasons, etc. Please call (905) 294-5563 and leave a message. As explained in the next message below, this process will be changing shortly!

It is important to note that research indicates that significant absence from school has a detrimental affect on student performances. It is for this reason that we discourage extended holidays. If your child is away from school for an extended period of time this will undoubtedly create gaps in their learning. It is not expected that teachers provide work for students for extended periods of absence from school. As a result we would ask you to consider carefully when withdrawing your children from school. If your child will be absent for an extended period of time, please inform the office and fill out an Extended Absence Form located in our main office. Thank you!



Safe Arrival Program



At Boxwood Public School, one of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely to school each and every day. As a part of our safe arrival process, a daily absence check is conducted by office staff and often involves:

Checking phone messages left by parents regarding sick calls for students Phoning parents whose child is absent but no notification has been made to the school Recording all absences in the attendance system

This process can be inefficient and time consuming for schools and for parents.

To enhance our existing absence check procedure, Boxwood Public School is one of a number of schools introducing *a new, more efficient* student absence or late arrival reporting system. This new system will reduce the time it takes to verify student attendance making it easier for you to report your child's absence and easier for staff to respond to unaccounted student absences.

We will be introducing a new absence reporting system to our parent community, called Safe Arrival. It will allow parents to report their child's absence quickly and conveniently in one of three ways:

- Parents can call into an automated interactive telephone system via a toll free number through which absences can be reported.
- Parents can log into a website to authenticate their Portal account to report absences and update contact information.
- Parents who have authenticated their accounts and have either an iOS or Android device can download an app that can be used to report absences.

The system will be available **24 hours/day**, **7 days a week**. Future absences can be reported at any time. You will be receiving more instructions on how to register at the end of the month.


