WELCOME: CALL TO ORDER

- sign-in sheet circulated by Secretary
- currently 6 voting members present, so will vote via email if needed; NB: 7th member eventually joined meeting (so can vote)
- meeting called to order by Chair
- November Minutes adopted
- voting by household and numbering now clear in Minutes
- Members Khera and Mirza indicated they won't be attending today's meeting to Chair
- will skip portions of math discussion today as Member Mirza requested discussion and isn't present today

TREASURER'S REPORT

- current balance = \$9,296.37
- cash end balance (after expenses) = \$2,955.01
- as of December 17, 2018: \$1,001.04 in credit to account
- as of December 17, 2018: \$1,375.84 debit to account
- as mentioned before, numbers will change once Treasurer gets updated statement
- Treasurer's Report approved

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STUDENT SCHOOL COUNCIL ACCOUNT AND MILK PROGRAM FUNDS

- per principal: there is a minimal amount in account (approx. \$15.00)
- approximately \$3,000.00 in milk generated funds
 - Principal indicated school can allocate \$1,000.00 towards Cost Sharing
 - school would like to keep \$2,000.00 in the account in order to help cover other costs (i.e. Grade 8 graduation)
 - school would like to pay difference after student contribution (\$50/per student) and PSC funds (\$15/per student)
 - Principal indicated school has flexibility to contribute this \$1,000.00 based on historical data (so if students pay \$50/each and PSC contributes \$15/student as it did last year, school will use milk program generated funds to cover any overage)

GRADE 8 GRADUATION

- 40 students are graduating this year
- if PSC contributes \$15 per student, this = \$600.00
- costs
 - o Shangri La venue
 - Buffet meal
 - o DJ
 - NB: no photo or video
- we will earmark \$600.00 for Grade 8 graduation and will **revisit contribution amount in April**, closer to graduation, to determine final costs and if a higher contribution is required
- Treasurer indicated he will put aside \$600 for now

MATH MANIPULATIVES UPDATE

• total for math manipulates is \$3,250.00

PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

- Boxwood events: completed
 - o Winter concert
 - \circ band performance at senior homes today (December 19) with Ms. Joo and band
- Boxwood events: ongoing and upcoming

 - Pajama Day (Friday, December 21)
 - holiday sing along
 - Winter vacation (December 24-January 6)
- Boxwood blog
 - \circ $\:$ stay up to date with our events and learning through our Boxwood blog $\:$
 - Principal took us through blog and showed us some of the posts (i.e. what kids are learning in the classroom i.e. example of an anchor chart, rubric marking scheme teachers use, literacy centers, working on paragraph writing, etc.)

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- last week he focused on math → on primary math work they are doing in different classes (additions strategies, mental math strategies, etc.) – good practice before engaging in a unit, use math diagnostics to see where kids are to identify areas of strengths and weakness
- SK 1 reading, measurement
- blog is a way for parents to be connected to some of the learning that's happening in the classroom;
 Principal tries to post once a week (tries to focus on a division in each post)
 - member Q: is the blog mandated by the YRDSB? no, this is an initiative by Principal
- Cost Sharing
 - o program offered by YRDSB to get more technology in the building
 - Principal can't provide a firm estimate on the cost of order now as the spreadsheet hasn't been released yet (Jan. 7)
 - \circ $\;$ estimate costs (Principal's calculations) are as follows
 - 5 laptops: \$4,125.00
 - 2 iPads: \$800.00
 - 25 Chromebooks: \$7162.50
 - total approx. cost: \$12,087.50 (without taxes we pay up to 5k)
 - approximately \$286 for Chromebooks vs. \$800 for laptops via Cost Sharing program
 - based on enrolment; w/ our enrollment number this year, we fall in the 300 and 499 category; schools with less get 1:2 and ones with more get 1:1
 - Performance Plus schools, regardless of their enrolment (schools deemed in need based on socioeconomics, determined by census), get a little bit more resources
 - Boxwood is not identified as a P+ school; our funding assistance is based on enrolment numbers
 - Primaries don't use Google as much; they use iPads more
 - Chromebooks are laptops that are just Google based you don't save anything on the computer you have a Google drive, which is cloud based
 - kids are allowed to use their own laptops and Chromebooks; some kids bring their devices to school but not many
 - o order window: January 7 (we have till April 12)
 - if we can put in CS order by January 7, we should get items in February
 - asking for 5k for Cost Sharing, \$600 for G8 Graduation set aside and Principal can give 1k from milk funds
 - contribution: PSC = \$4,200.00, school = \$800.00

FUNDING

- last week we said priorities for funding are:
 - \circ technology
 - \circ math manipulatives
 - \circ Grade 8 graduation
 - o field trip bussing
- math manipulatives amount of \$3,250.00 hasn't been taken out yet
- Principal to find out re: bussing (latest trip: 2 senior homes today, G5 to G8 band)
- \$4,200 for CS contribution from PSC; anything we have left will be for field trip bussing (can look at this end of January)
- funding

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- \$9,296.37 (current balance) \$3,250.00 (math manipulatives) = \$6,046.37
- \$6,046.37 \$600.00 (G8 graduation, amount earmarked) = \$5,446.37
- one more Paramount lunch needs to be covered \$4,200.00 (CS) leaves us with approximately \$1,246.00 which is enough for last Paramount lunch (Jan 9) and new orders will be coming in to bring in more funds
- NB: printers are supplied by the board (not something we need to purchase)

MATH UPDATE, PER PRINCIPAL

- Principal shared results of school's math diagnostic at the last meeting
- going to release teachers at the beginning of February for half a day (3 times) to plan in division teams using a comprehensive math program - framework and chart student progress (focus on thinking and application Qs)
- teachers (in grade teams) will have a **planning** session, a **check-in** session, and a session to review the **results of a final task**
- going to plan together and do some assessments together
- collaborative math topics covered; areas that need extra attention this info came from results of the diagnostic assessments (general thing across the board and province is problem solving – thinking and application question)

PRINCIPAL PROFILE

- as Principals are reallocated to different schools after some time, it's important for parents to voice what type of principal we'd like for our school community
- profile will communicate the most important attributes that a principal or VP should have in order to meet the identified needs of the school
- Principal might be allocated for another school since he was VP for a year and Principal for 4 years now
- most influential way we have to exercise our voice is via principal profile
 - \circ can say, this is the type of person, the type of skills we want
 - when they are placing people at YRDSB, they have the principal profile with them, and they consider it when they allocate principals to schools
- Principal has past Principal Profile; also has an example of 2 different styles from provincial principal profile
 - Principal stepped out of the room to give us flexibility to discuss openly what we want
 - reviewed existing PP; PSC read existing profile everyone quietly to themselves
 - o discussed what we want
 - administrator should encourage more feedback between parents and teachers
 - administrator should encourage more consistent use of technology by teachers (in particular, the way teachers communicate with parents via technology should be more consistent)
 - administrator should be in tune with needs of students
 - administrator should work with parent community for the betterment of all students
 - administrator should have a history of working collaboratively in a supportive and understanding way with students with special needs (and their parents)
 - administrator should be proactive in seeking parent feedback
