WELCOME: CALL TO ORDER

- sign-in sheet circulated by Secretary
- meeting called to order by Chair
- to adopt Minutes from December and February meetings at next meeting

TREASURER'S REPORT

- current balance = \$5,335.63 (after accounting for Grade 8 graduation contribution of \$600.00)
- as per usual, Treasurer will update the report once he gets latest statement
- Treasurer's Report approved

FUNDING

- NB: we said, in the past, we'd reassess Grade 8 graduation contribution
- Principal's funding request (more specific details to follow in Principal's Update)
 - o school budget is spread thin b/c of math release days
 - o funding request of \$500.00 for a guest speaker (Duane Gibson) for the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination
 - o this is for Grades 3-8 and Intermediate students will be doing workshop
 - Chair will send out email
 - o per Treasurer: we have the funds to cover this cost
- last meeting (February 19) Parent School Council (PSC) discussed funding for mats for the school gym
 - o may ask for funding for mats next or to revisit funding for mats in May

PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

- upcoming events
 - o coding workshops: March 19-21
 - a company comes in and set up workshops; most kids get a computer and 2 instructors work with kids on coding
 - Math planning release days: March 20 and 25
 - Grade 1 to 8 doing fractions (diagnostic assessment said fractions area of improvement); Ks doing counting #s
 - International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination assembly: March 21
 - o Grades 6-8 ski trip: March 22
 - Grade 6 Junior Achievement: March 26
 - people from business community come to school and talk about what they do (career planning, etc.)
 - grad picture day: April 3
 - o Grade 7 vaccinations: April 17
 - o no school April 19 and 22 (Good Friday and Easter)
- math professional learning update
 - on March 20 and 25, our teachers will be engaging in our final math collaborative inquiry on fractions
 - o teachers will be marking students' final assessments
 - Ms. Brown and Principal will also be retesting students on their original assessment to see how much they have progressed
- coding workshop
 - o the "code mobile" will be @ Boxwood to run workshops from Tuesday, March 19 to Thursday, March 21
 - o workshops are free and the coding crew will bring MacBooks with them
 - o there will be enough computers for students to share, and, in some cases, 1:1 student use
 - the coding crew will run the workshops
 - o Ms. Calverley has created a schedule for the classes; kids come down as a class and have 100-minute sessions (morning to recess is a class, then to lunch is another class, and then to the end of day is another class)
 - basic computer programming
 - o for all students: Ks to 8
- The International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination
 - background: on March 21, 1960 police opened fire and killed 69 people at a peaceful demonstration in South Africa resulting in the UN calling on the international community to double its efforts to eliminate all forms of racial discrimination
 - o 2 years ago, we had someone come in and speak on shadeism
 - Intermediate learning for Black History Month
 - reading Dear Martin
 - learning the difference b/w equality and equity
 - Intermediate grades will be hosting an assembly as a culminating task
 - will have a variety of student presentations on a wide range of topics that have been discussed inclass throughout the school year; topics include, but are not limited to: free speech, affirmative action, racial profiling, everyone welcome – refugee crisis
 - presentations made today and students picked who will present at the assembly (via secret ballot)
 - working on a written form: a rant (Grade 7s and 8s)
 - assembly is for Grades 3-8
 - funding request
 - to support this event, school has scheduled a public speaker, Duane Gibson, to speak to Boxwood students and facilitate some workshops for Intermediate students

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- Gibson is a Guinness world record setting rapper, author, and university graduate who was on the Dean's List
- he has spoken at more than 500 schools focusing on anti-bullying, literacy and character education
- Principal showed PSC a clip of Gibson speaking
- his fee is \$500.00
- o other
 - right now, kids have pavement-only recess b/c grass is very wet; Ks area still has a lot of ice (they went on a walk today) and stayed indoors for lunch

GOVERNMENT CHANGES TO CLASS SIZES, ETC.

- class sizes
 - hasn't trickled down to elementary schools yet
 - o no decisions regarding Ks and Junior and Intermediate size goals increased a little bit
 - O NB: more students in a class = less classes = less teachers
 - we are not there yet
 - o class size changes government has made affect high schools
 - o cap means every class has to be compliant by a certain date; once date has passed, no cap
 - Junior Intermediate average (board wide but individual classes can exceed)
- math curriculum isn't that different than what we presently have
 - o Principal will bring examples next time
 - Fundamentals of Math document
 - o as mentioned before, we need to do better in problem solving, conceptual understanding
 - o there will be more emphasis on counting, etc.
 - o changes will be next year
- health curriculum
 - o gone back to old curriculum (change in content and age)
 - o maybe have another session
