#### WELCOME: CALL TO ORDER (7:14 PM)

- sign-in sheet circulated
- meeting called to order by Elsa Chan, last year's Chair
  - o thank you to everyone for attending and investing your free time
- outline of today's meeting
  - o today: take care of some housekeeping and some quick planning to set us up for the year
  - as per email, we can get through the elections and get the year started off on the right foot (all the sooner we can get started on activities, especially fundraising)
  - can decide on meeting dates
  - o get an update on the Treasurer's Report
  - o a few outstanding transactions we want to close up as well to get the books balanced
  - Elsa Chan has 3 open action items from the end of last year that we can quickly follow up on
  - Principal can then give us his updates and school calendar
  - o instructions going around
- NB: Boxwood has only one principal no VP this year (Principal will discuss the reasons for this)

#### SCHOOL COUNCIL (PER PRINCIPAL)

- welcome back on behalf of all the staff and thanks for all the efforts and the work SC does; students have benefitted
- purpose of SC: promoting student learning and family and community engagement
  - one idea to get more parents to attend SC meetings: having topics that parents would find engaging and ones that relate to their child's experience at school (i.e. homework, nutrition)
- we are always looking at equity; how do we support all of the students?
  - for example, last year's SC was cognizant of the pricing of food and whether students were able to afford them
- Student Improvement Plan
- give advice to you on school related matters; if you hear or see something, approach SC and say, "I think it could work this way" or give feedback to principal

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- SC members also talk to other people about SC; the Principal is just one person, but parents have different relationships with other parents
  - SC has put many efforts over the years to financially support school (i.e. Bingo Night, pizza lunches)
  - o school uses those funds to support things at school
  - $\circ$  b/c we use a lot of technology have purchased items with funds raised by SC
- to be a School Council member:
  - o can't be employed by school
  - child has to be at school
  - one parent per household for voting (but any number can attend)
- we have to have at least 4 meetings a year
- majority of parents have to be present to make decisions (quorum)
- decision making: we strive to have consensus, however, sometimes that doesn't happen (then we vote)
- elections: parents may be elected or it can be appointment based (depending on what's happening with that particular council)
- members for executive positions can be nominated or self-nominated
- executive positions:
  - Chair or Co-Chair (Principal likes idea of co-chairs sharing responsibility)
  - o Treasurer
  - o Secretary
- can have private/secret ballot
- last year's committee dissolved and new committee has to form
- the parents in attendance today are this year's SC
- if someone is not here, can they be nominated? no
- NB: Member Prasad of last year's SC is absent but will be returning this year as a member
- Principal went through SC forms sent out to parents

#### SCHOOL #s AND TEACHERS

- 384 students this year
- last year = 406
- we were projected to have 350, but had a number of new registrations
- some schools are losing teachers and some are gaining b/c they have less or more students
- balance resources
- what they factor in is that are the primary caps (NB: primary grades = 1-3)
  - classes can't be over 20 students (grades 1-3)
  - $\circ$  older grades: just an aiming number which can be exceeded (like 25)
  - kindergarten: max of 30
- JK and SKs have two staff and a teacher (that's why they go up to 30 students)
- we've kept a lot of our teachers
- Principal was hoping to get another teacher b/c the junior classes (grades 4 and 5) are quite full @ 30 students
- Grade 7s are in the high 20s
- 2 new replacements: Ms. Brown is on maternity leave (Mr. Kim has taken over for her) and Mr. McCaw left (retirement)

# SC EXECUTIVE POSITIONS

- discussed rules re: election when, etc.
- suggestion by Member Dogra: form sent out to parents re: SC positions should clearly state that parents have to be
  present at the first meeting to be elected (Principal will add it to his advertisement but can't change form b/c it's a
  YRDSB form)

- per Chair: there are 4 roles 2 Co-Chairs, Treasurer, Secretary
- express of interest:
  - Chair Chan is interested in being one of the Co-Chairs
  - o Treasurer Kadakia would like to try being the other Co-Chair
  - we have two Co-Chairs, we have a Secretary, we need a Treasurer
    - Member Mitra volunteered to fill the position of Treasurer

## **GENERAL FUNDRAISING & FINANCES**

- \$3,103.60 = ending balance
- SCO surcharge
  - everything is done through SCO (option of paying via SCO or cheque)
  - we spent \$324.00 for online fees
  - we absorbed the cost of the SCO surcharge last year
  - this year, we should get parents to pay cost
  - Principal doesn't think this will impact sales negatively
  - per Principal (explanation re: surcharge)
    - all funds are processed via the School Online Cash system
    - there's an admin charge of 3%
    - last year, with pizza and subs, School Council absorbed the cost
- per Co-Chair Chan (re: fundraising)
  - last year, the School Council funded the following items (lots of technology since it's important and continually integrated into the curriculum and classroom day-to-day)
    - Chromebooks
    - Dell laptops
    - Lego Robotic kits
    - purchased new school team uniforms
    - Grade 8 graduation (\$600.00 to be used as needed)
  - o School Council's contribution made an impact b/c computers used heavily
  - jerseys: kids love them (as per Principal)
    - first instalment taken into account in last year's budget; final instalment is in December and hasn't been accounted for (possible we can get another donation via the RPA)
  - pizza lunch orders were lower b/c we have less students
  - o also: younger kids preorder (Ks, for example, while older kids pay cash
- need to document SCO contingency plan in the event of an interruption, how to keep things going so we don't disrupt fundraising
  - Chair explained: last year, b/c of office staff strike parents couldn't move forward with fundraising b/c there was nobody to make deposits
- b/c we have fewer students this year, does it change our funding picture? we were already at the lowest
- for computers, YRDSB offers a program: Cost Sharing
  - we can spend a certain amount of money and Board matches it w/ an amount for computers (not a huge amount but good)
  - o this is where SC put a lot of its funds and it was helpful in getting computers

#### **BOOSTER JUICE SAMPLING (FUNDRAISING)**

- Chair introduced smoothie samples
- they are in line with the healthy school, healthy eating philosophy
- would get it on different day of pizza, etc.
- larger sizes provided (appropriate for Gr. 8)

- small size: 355ml
- there's one in between the larger one and 355ml
- full serving of fruit based on size they get for age
- one flavour for whole season? Co-Chair Chan to find out
- samples:

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- Cranberry Cyclone (bananas, pineapples, raspberries, cranberries)
- Pineapple Chill (strawberries, pineapple, bananas)
- Mango Mania (mango, strawberries, passion fruit, guava)
- Starberry (strawberries, passion fruit, guava, bananas)
- Berry Blossom (strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, passion fruit guava)
- they make them ahead and put them in freezer for distribution (so they will be cold when they reach students)
- they do a school on Wednesdays; maybe we can do a different day?
- of the samples, SC liked: Cranberry Cyclone, Pineapple Chill, Starberry and Mano Mania
- you pay for what you get real fruit
  - small one = \$3.25
  - larger size = \$5.00
- depending on what we get, we may get a different deal
- \$5.75 and \$8.00 with wrap (we'll charge more to make a profit for fundraising so maybe just smoothie only?)
- suggestion: let's keep it all small vs. different sizes or large size
- we are going to go with the 355 ml (4 choices noted above) and no wraps
- Co-Chair Chan is to talk to them to see if we can get a better deal

## PIZZA FUNDRAISING

- pizza fundraising can start as soon as Co-Chair Chan sends out form
  - she has to do new grids
  - o plan: ask for forms back on Tuesday, after PA day?
  - if Co-Chair Chan can get form to principal by Friday morning, then Principal can have forms go out with students that day
  - o if we send it out Friday, ask for forms to be returned by Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> (giving parents a day after PA day)
- start pizza on Friday, October 7 (12 Fridays)
- Co-Chair Chan will take a look at how we split the pizza days
- are we continuing with Famous Pizza is owner still in business still there?
  - o Per Co-Chair Kadakia: was same owner two weeks back
  - $\circ$  if we don't go with Famous, then Pizza Pizza
  - $\circ$   $\;$  we'll stick with Famous and look at PP later if we need
- for every slice, child has to pay .05 more, so shouldn't we get them to pay the surcharge so we can purchase a computer?
- how much are we going to charge per slice on the order? 1.50 per slice + 3% would be \$1.55
- so parents pay for surcharge all in favour

#### **ADMINISTRATION UPDATE (PRINCIPAL)**

- extracurricular activities
  - o Intermediate Boys and Girls volley ball (7s and 8s)
  - o later on, we will do mixed volley ball (4-6)
  - o cross country (4-8)
  - last year none of this was happening b/c of strike
  - we have many different activities that happen throughout the year: knitting club, etc.
  - o we also have house leagues (primary house league, Jr. and intermediate)

- some upcoming dates
  - $\circ~$  error on the newsletter: PA on Monday 26th, not on the 28th
  - Terry Fox walk coming up Tuesday
  - $\circ$  busy end of the month
  - Markham Fair trip: 1-6
- PA days, students don't come to school but teachers do
  - training happens on PA days
    - anaphylaxis
    - WHMIS (Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System)
    - any other safety training
    - Iock downs
    - fire drills
    - evacuation
- some curriculum information
  - o big focus on math
  - o our math scores (EQAO) is at the provincial level (preliminary results)
  - o language scores are really high while our math scores are more in line with the province
  - o is our math performance in line with the decrease overall? yes
  - idea for "hot topic" for parents: how to supplement traditional math lessons (issue btwn. traditional vs. flexible)
  - o some discussion re: the math curriculum
- we rec'd funding again this year (\$850.00 via PRO, Parents Reaching Out grant)
  - o we're looking to focus on the lesson
  - o parents experiencing the lesson that their children would receive
  - o what that lesson looks like, how it's similar and different to what we as parents as students
  - Curriculum Night: Thursday, October 6
    - see teachers, routines, thing in the classrooms, not an opportunity for an interview
- parent-teacher interviews November 24 and 25th (will be putting that in the upcoming newsletter)

#### PARENT ISSUES

- we want more communication b/w teachers and parents
- when one member asks her son what he did at school, he replies, "not much"
- parents are unsure about what's happening in the class
- Member Sukumar noted that her teacher's class has email
- Principal is really working on ways to maintain communication with parents the more you communicate with parents the less anxiety they have
  - again, we have to take into consideration that different teachers have different levels of comfort with technology
- suggestion for Principal for PA: can he discuss with teachers whether they'd be willing to let parents know, ahead of time, the specifics of what they're going to be teaching (so parents can prep students)
