Course Description

The Drama Production course is designed to give students an opportunity to learn all areas of theatrical production: creative, technical, and administrative. Students will engage in producing a stage production of their own choice and take on the various positions that the workshops were based on to be performed for the National Theatre School DramaFest. **This course may require some rehearsal outside of class time.**

Assessment and Evaluation

Assessment and Evaluation is based on the provincial curriculum expectations and achievement levels. Its primary purpose is to improve student learning by allowing the teacher to provide descriptive feedback to students and suggested strategies for improvement. A variety of assessment and evaluation tools will be used during this course including checklists, student-teacher conferencing, written feedback, rubrics, etc.
