Art Department Grade 9 Non Traditional Art AWS101 - Open Course Outline 1 Full Credit Prerequisite: None



Course Description

This course enables students to create and interpret media art works by exploring new media, emerging technologies such as digital animation, and a variety of traditional art forms such as film, photography, video, and visual arts. Students will acquire communication skills that are transferable beyond the media arts classroom and develop an understanding of responsible practices related to the creative process.

Each unit will include necessary and relevant art theory and art history handouts, presentations, demonstrations, examples, etc. This course will cover the following units. Minor changes may occur as the semester progresses.

Course Expectations

While some assignments may require independent time to complete at lunch, after school, or at home, students are expected to complete at least 50% of all work <u>in class</u> in order to qualify for evaluation.

Assessment and Evaluation

Assessment and evaluation is based on the provincial curriculum expectations and achievement levels. Its primary purpose is to improve student learning by allowing the teacher to provide descriptive feedback to students and suggesting strategies for improvement. A variety of assessment and evaluation tools will be used during this course including checklists, student teacher conferencing, written feedback, rubrics, etc.

Learning skills will be assessed in terms of attendance, punctuality, being prepared and equipped, material use and clean-up, participation in class discussions, demonstration of group skills, homework & project completion, along with subject-specific criteria. This data will be collected and used to assess students' **responsibility, organization, independent work, collaboration, initiative, self regulation.**

Student may <u>not</u> use electronic translators nor paper dictionaries during quizzes, tests, and exams but may ask the teacher for clarification at any point during the assessment.

Google Classroom

Digital Literacy

Students are encouraged to use the arts as a way of exploring language and developing their verbal, visual and written skills. Students will have the opportunity to develop literacy skills as they communicate analytically and critically.

Each student will be provided all necessary materials needed to complete the course. If enhancement materials are desired students may choose to purchase them at their own expense.

Health and Safety

Students are instructed in the safe and proper handling, clean-up, and storage of classroom materials and equipment. Attention must be given to these instructions.

Students will be encouraged to explore educational and career opportunities related to Media Arts. The teacher will help students identify ways in which their involvement in the arts enhances their suitability for a wide range of occupations.
