## **Course Description**

This course allows students to broaden their knowledge and skills in the field of Visual Arts. Students are encouraged to produce a body of creative work that represents a progressive record of studio development in both technique and creativity. All units relate to the various aspects of human expression developing from the self, to other individuals, to the global community. Presentation skills will also be developed which connect historical inspiration, the creative process, and personal interpretation.

#### Assessment and Evaluation

Assessment and evaluation is based on the provincial curriculum expectations and the achievement levels outlined in *The Ontario Curriculum*, *Grade 11 and 12*, *The Arts*, *2010*. Its primary purpose is to improve student learning by allowing the teacher to provide descriptive feedback to students and suggesting strategies for improvement.

Learning skills will be assessed in terms of attendance, punctuality, being prepared and equipped, material use and clean-up, participation in class discussions, demonstration of group skills, homework & project completion, along with subject-specific criteria. This data will be collected and used to assess students' **responsibility**, **organization**, **independent work**, **collaboration**, **initiative**, **and self regulation**.

Students may <u>not</u> use electronic translators nor paper dictionaries during quizzes, tests, and exams but may ask the teacher for clarification at any point during the assessment.

## **Google Classroom**

## **Literacy Skills**

Students are encouraged to use the arts as a way of exploring language and developing their verbal, visual and written skills. Students will have the opportunity to develop literacy skills as they communicate analytically and critically.

## **Supplies and Equipment**

Each student will be provided all necessary materials needed to complete the course. If enhancement materials are desired students may choose to purchase them at their own expense. Discovering Art History by Gerald F. Brommer will be used as an in-class resource.

# **Health and Safety**

Students are instructed in safe and proper clean up procedures. Attention must be given to the safe handling and storage of materials and equipment.

Students will be encouraged to explore educational and career opportunities related to The Arts. The teacher will help students identify ways in which their involvement in The Arts enhances their suitability for a wide range of occupations.
