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Student Return and Retrieval of Items:

Students and families may now arrange to safely pick up items they left at school and return items that belong to the YRDSB during the week of June 15th - June 19th. Students can sign up for a time using TeachAssist.


Only 30 students are allowed in the building at a time. Students must use hand sanitizer on entering the building, observe social distancing, bring their own bag to put their personal items in and are encouraged to wear a mask.

Students will enter at the front of the school and exit through the back. Parents and siblings who do not attend BOSS will not be allowed to enter with students.

School items will be left in the cafeteria with the exception of music supplies which will be returned to 1050

Message from the Director

Dear Families.

As we approach the end of the school year, we wanted to provide updates and information on a number of topics that you may have questions about. While we don't have all the information at this time, we will endeavour to share as much as possible and provide further updates as they become available.

Mental Health Support and Tips for Parents Related to Anti-Black Racism

As mentioned in <u>previous messages</u>, our Board is taking significant steps to address anti-Black racism and support our students and staff. We have heard from our community partners that families are looking for support and referrals, particularly those that will continue to be available throughout the summer. As such, we have posted information on our website with <u>mental health support</u> and age appropriate <u>resources for families to discuss anti-Black racism</u>. We know there continues to be much work to be done to address anti-Black racism, and we will continue to update the Board's website with more information on resources and actions, including live virtual sessions for Black children and families and partnership opportunities and services offered by Black community organizations.

Device Collection

Did you borrow a chrome book or internet device from your child's school?

- At this time, devices will only be collected from students who are leaving YRDSB (i.e., students who are graduating or transferring to another school board).
- Students who are staying in the York Region District School Board for the 2020-21 school year can hold onto their devices until further notice.
- For those students who are araduating or leaving YRDSB, please return your device next week.

Student Material Retrieval and Return Process

- During the week of June 15, students and their families will have the opportunity to retrieve personal items from their classrooms/lockers in their school.
- Students/families have received notification from their school and are asked to sign up for a specific date/time.
- Students are also asked to return any school items such as library books, musical instruments, textbooks, etc.

Graduations, Scholarships and Recognition

- As previously communicated, all graduations have been postponed until the fall.
- Scholarships and awards will be determined in June and awards will officially be presented in the fall, Monetary awards will be distributed to recipients over the summer.
- Students will get most documents at graduation in the fall. This includes diplomas, certificates, SHSM certificates, class photos, etc.
- To help recognize graduates from both our elementary and secondary schools, each school will have a congratulatory banner placed on the outside of the building.
- Grade 12 students who need a copy of their transcript can contact their school to request a copy.

Last Day of School/PD days

- As per the direction from the Ministry of Education, all remaining PD days for the 2019-2020 school year are now instructional days.
- This means that the PD days originally scheduled on June 25 (for secondary) and June 26 (for elementary and secondary) will be instructional days.
- Teachers will have office hours scheduled on these dates.
- Online platforms, e.g., Google Classroom, for students to access will continue to be available to the end of the school year.
- As teachers will be on summer break after June 26, online platform sites will not be monitored. To ensure student online safety, access will be discontinued by June 26 (the last day of school).

2020-2021 School Year Calendar

- The proposed 2020-2021 School Year Calendars were submitted to the Ministry of Education for review and final approval.
- Due to the current conditions, the Ministry has stated that the review and approval process has been put on pause and is indicating Boards should receive a response later this month.
- Calendars are not official until they receive formal Ministry approval and will be communicated as soon as we receive approval.

YRDSB Summer Programs

- To help reduce the spread of COVID-19, Continuing Education Services is adjusting its Summer Learning program offerings to align with public health guidelines.
- As a result, Summer Institute programming (scheduled to run July 6 August 14) is cancelled for this summer.
- Refunds will be remitted to those who have already registered and paid by early June. If you have any questions or have not received your refund, please contact Performanceplus.si@yrdsb.ca.
- Please note this applies to Summer Institute only and other <u>summer programs</u>, such as summer school, will be proceeding where possible within an online environment.
- Traditional in-class, face-to-face summer programs will move to a remote learning delivery model as per Ministry direction.
- We will continue to follow Ministry direction and if there are any changes to our program delivery model we will communicate those changes.
- We encourage families and students to continue to monitor our <u>Board's website</u>, and Twitter account, <u>@YRDSB</u>, as updated information will be posted in those forums.

September 2020

- The Ministry of Education has stated that they are working on a framework for reopening of schools in September.
- We are expecting to receive further information on this framework later this month and will update parents as soon as we are able.
- For the school year start, we will be developing plans for how orientation days (i.e., Grade 9 Transition day, Kindergarten Orientation day) will be facilitated within the Ministry's framework.

We know this has been a very stressful and challenging year, and we want to thank all of our students, families and staff for their patience as we have worked through finding new ways to learn together. We expect to have more information about school reopening in the next couple of weeks and will share this information as soon as it becomes available. We look forward to welcoming our students, staff and families back to school.

NEW! Grade 8 Reach Ahead 2020 Summer Credit Language Program & Grade 9 to 12 Students (Spanish & Mandarin)

- Grade 8 students can now take a Grade 9 credit course this summer in Spanish or Mandarin.
- Grades 9 to 12 students can now take Level B or C summer credit courses in Spanish or Mandarin.
- Prerequisites are not required for any Level B international languages course.
- This is an 18-day program (July 6-29, Monday to Friday, 8:45 a.m. to 3:33 p.m. daily) for one credit introductory (Level B) international languages course.
