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Dear Bur Oak students and families, I would like to take a moment to share some current reflections about recent world and closer to home events that show anti-Black racism continues to exist.

The murders of George Floyd and Ahmaud Arbery; the questionable death of Regis Korchinski-Paquet, and the blatant threat against Christian Cooper in New York simply because he is black were just a few examples of anti-Black racism that have been reported recently. Three out of four of these incidences were recorded and these videos have horrified the world. I can only imagine if we were in a time without cellphones. I can only imagine the number of anti-Black racist verbal and physical assaults, and murders that have not been recorded and/or have not been brought to justice.

This time of learning and working from home has brought too many incidences of anti-Black racism to my attention at BOSS. There have been anti-Black racist slurs and treatment against students, staff, and a community member during the past few months. Every incident brought to my attention has been and will be thoroughly investigated. Unfortunately, verbal assaults and anti-Black racism committed through social media occurs on a too frequent basis. Hiding behind technology is cowardly. Reporting these incidences is courageous.

I know that we have Black students, staff, and community members who still do not feel safe or welcomed at BOSS. This information is so concerning for me. I am committed to changing this; and I also need to change this for all racialized and marginalized students. I will need help to continue this work. We first need to reflect and understand how privilege affects how we think, behave, conduct ourselves, and treat Black, Indigenous, and people of colour.

We can continue to read, dialogue, and attend learning opportunities about equity. What needs to happen now must begin and end with actions that actually make a change for Black students, staff, and community; call out and address racist behaviour when it happens, ensure that we have high standards and expectations for all students and show that student voice matters and counts.

This works starts with an honest reflection of ourselves. Ijeoma Oluo a Seattle based author who wrote, "So You Want to Talk about Race" said,

"The beauty of anti-racism is that you don't have to pretend to be free of racism to be an anti-racist. Anti-racism is the commitment to fight racism wherever you find it, including in yourself. And it's the only way forward."

What is happening in the world, in Ontario, at YRDSB, at BOSS is not okay. We need to step up and do better for Black students, staff, and community. We need to do better for all racialized and marginalized people.

I know that the past few weeks have deeply affected Black students, staff and the community and many others. Continue to call out racist behaviour and incidences and report it. For those that have done so already, thank you for your courage to speak up. Also, please note that if you need support to reach out to myself, a teacher, or anyone else who you feel comfortable with to share your concerns. The York Region District School Board website (www.yrdsb.ca) can also provide you with support, resources, and individuals for support.

Summer School 2020-21

YRDSB Summer School courses will continue to be offered during the month of July. To help reduce the spread of COVID-19, Continuing Education Services is adjusting its Summer Learning program offerings to align with public health guidelines. Please be advised that our traditional in class face-to-face summer programs will move to a remote learning delivery model as per Ministry direction. We will continue to follow Ministry direction and if there are any changes to our program delivery model we will communicate those changes to the system.

For students who have already registered for traditional face-to-face summer school programs, their registration will be forwarded as part of the remote learning delivery model. This model will be home-based learning with more details to follow. There is no need to re-apply or switch to an alternate model for students continuing to wish to proceed with summer programs.

For students wishing still to register for summer school, please review the offerings for both Remote Learning Summer School and eLearning Summer School. Once you have decided on your program choice, you must complete the Bur Oak Request form before registering for any summer credit program. (Please note, this also includes Private School and International Languages programs offered in other school boards)

NEW! Grade 8 Reach Ahead 2020 Summer Credit Language Program & Grade 9 to 12 Students (Spanish & Mandarin)

- Grade 8 students can now take a Grade 9 credit course this summer in Spanish or Mandarin.
- Grades 9 to 12 students can now take Level B or C summer credit courses in Spanish or Mandarin.
- Prerequisites are not required for any Level B international languages course.
- This is an 18-day program (July 6-29, Monday to Friday, 8:45 a.m. to 3:33 p.m. daily) for one credit introductory (Level B) international languages course.
