It's almost March Break! Time to think about self-care

As we approach March Break, it is important for adults and students to think about how we take care of ourselves – how we can de-stress by incorporating strategies into our lifestyle to avoid burnout and stress induced illness.

Maria Baratta, Ph.D., L.C.S.W., Clinician in New York speaks about <u>Self Care 101</u>. Here are the 10 strategies that she speaks about:

Self care means knowing who you are and your limits.

Self care means getting the sleep you need and knowing how to rest

Self care means making sure that you're well fed.

Self care means finding a way to decompress *throughout* your day, not just when you leave work or school.

Self care means giving some thought to change a difficult work situation.

Self care means taking time to get to know you better.

Self care means identifying what you enjoy doing and what's fun for you and make a serious effort to integrate it into your day or, at the very least, your week

Self care means knowing how to debrief from a day's work or day of

school. Self care means feeding your spiritual self.

Self care means taking time to love yourself and appreciating that there's only one you and you're the expert on that.

Release of the YRDSB Student Suicide Intervention Protocol

York Region District School Board is committed to student well-being and mental health. YRDSB has developed a Student Suicide Intervention Protocol to help keep students safe in the event of suicidal thoughts or actions. The Student Suicide Intervention Protocol will be implemented starting Fall 2019. Youth suicide is a complex, emotionally-charged and sadly a real problem in Canada. It is the second leading cause of death amongst young people. It's important to recognize that those who struggle with mental health have personal strength and resilience and the potential to overcome difficulties to ultimately thrive.



The YRDSB Student Suicide Intervention Protocol is designed to address the six steps involved when responding to current and present thoughts of suicide, as well as actions related to suicide. In addition, the Protocol is governed by a set of guiding principles which are underpinned by a culturally responsive and reflective practice.

Suicide is not culturally neutral. Our cultural and ethnic backgrounds will inform how each of us understands suicide. The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) is **Tuesday**, **March 31**, **2020**. All students who wish to graduate from an Ontario secondary school must fulfill their literacy requirement by being successful on the OSSLT or by taking the Ontario Literacy Course (OLC).

In preparation for the OSSLT, the **After School Literacy** course will be offered again in second semester. This is the final opportunity to take this preparation course before the OSSLT in March. The course is running from **February 11- March 12**, **every Tuesday and Thursday** from **3:00-4:30pm**. Please print, complete and sign the <u>registration form</u> **attached** and return it to Ms. Wan in the Learning Commons as soon as possible as registration closes on Wednesday, January 22. A paper copy of the registration form is also available for pick-up in the Learning Commons.

Arrivals and Departures

Parents/guardians who **drive their children to school** are reminded to follow the directional signs and use the designated areas for drop off and pick up at the **BACK** of the school. Please do not park in the bus / emergency zones and remember that there are no U-turns allowed in the front driveway. Failure to do so may result in fines and/or tickets as the front is designated a FIRE ROUTE.

Please remind your child to cross the road only at designated crosswalks. Student safety is our main concern and we thank you in advance for helping keep your child safe. **Please DO NOT drop your child off on Bur Oak Avenue** as this creates a dangerous situation both for your child and other cars.

Parking Reminders

Students who drive to school are reminded that use of the school parking lot is a privilege not a right. Students are expected to drive in accordance with provincial laws. All students are reminded that extreme caution must be used when driving in the school parking lot. Any student who drives carelessly or puts any student, staff member or community member at risk will lose their privilege to use the school parking lot. Parents/Guardians will be contacted and York Regional Police may also be notified.

Students may park in **designated areas** only in the south parking lot at the back of the school. Parking is not allowed in the Emergency Vehicles/Bus Route. To be eligible to use the lot, **students must**

- have a valid student card
- register their car at the office and obtain a parking permit. NOTE: Registration does not guarantee a parking spot.

Students who fail to comply with the parking regulations may:

- be towed at a substantial cost to the owner
- face a "drop" fee (once car is hooked to be towed)
- be ticketed (by the Town of Markham).





Bus or School Cancellations



With winter weather already here, we want to share some important reminders for families.

When an **inclement weather** or **extreme cold** day is declared, school transportation (including buses and taxis) are cancelled in the morning and afternoon. Schools will remain open. If you drive your child to school, or your child takes alternate transportation, you must make arrangements for your child to get home at the end of the day. Please call the school if your child will not be attending school on those days. Students will not be penalized for missing school on these days.

There may be rare instances when **emergency winter events** occur and we need to close all schools and Board locations. Please take the time to make plans in the event of an emergency school closure.

Information about transportation cancellations and Board closures will be shared through local media, <u>Board</u> and school website and on <u>twitter @YRDSB</u>.

Our process for extreme cold, inclement weather and emergency weather days are outlined in the Board's <u>Severe Weather policy</u>, which has been recently updated and is available for public comment. Seeking feedback from staff and community members, including parents/guardians, is an important part of the review process. All <u>policies</u> <u>available for comment</u> are sent to school council chairs and are posted on the Board website, along with information about how to provide feedback.
