Reminders

Warm Weather Attire:

With the return of warm weather, please take some time to review the appropriate attire policy with your son or daughter. Items that apply specifically for warm weather include:

- Shorts must be mid-thigh in length
- Shirts must meet bottoms (no bare midriff)
- Tank tops must have wide straps.

E-Learning Summer School

Summer school courses are also available in an E learning format. These courses are generally at the grade 11 and 12 levels. Students need to make a Guidance appointment to receive the paper part of the application. This will ensure that Guidance is aware that the student has signed up online. There is a \$20 fee for the application and this is paid as part of the online application. Summer school is only available in July and students cannot sign up for both classroom format and e-learning at the same time.

<u>Summer School Registration Continues</u>

Students are still able to register for classroom based summer school through Career Cruising. Students will need to book a guidance appointment to discuss their proposed plans.

- Acceleration (4 weeks)
- Reinforcement (2 weeks)—usually for students who were not successful in their first attempt

Playground Safety

This is a reminder for all students that concerns have been raised by community members about BOSS student behaviour, especially in Wismer Park. We would like to remind all students that appropriate behaviour and language is expected especially off property so that everyone can enjoy public spaces and feel safe and welcomed. We know that BOSS students will represent themselves and our school in a positive and respectful manner.

We ask that parents remind their children to use the playground equipment at Wismer Park appropriately and to behave in a manner that creates a safe play area for all community members.

After School Protocol

All students must leave school by 3:30 unless under the direct supervision of a teacher. The school is <u>not open on week-ends</u>. Students looking for a place to meet to work together are encouraged to use the Public Library.

Mon Sheong Golden Jubilee Scholarship

This scholarship is presented annually to students who demonstrate well-rounded excellence and desire to make real change—whether in their communities or around the world. Applicants are considered for academic standing, voluntary community involvement, leadership, character, and aspirations to make a difference.

This year there will be 3 recipients for the Mon Sheong Golden Jubilee Scholarship. Each recipient will receive \$1,000 per year for the duration of their studies, up to a maximum of 4 years (subject to renewal requirements).

The award is open to students who are:

- 1. Graduating from a Canadian high school or CEGEP with a minimum average of 80% among their top 6 grade 12 or CEGEP marks
- 2. Enrolled full-time in a degree or diploma program at a publicly funded Canadian university or college beginning Fall 2018 and
- 3. Aspiring to have an even greater impact through their education and experience.

Available Positions

A. York Region District School Board (YRDSB) invites parents/guardians of students attending schools in the following areas:

Membership is available for one-year or two-years on the Parent, Family and Community Engagement Advisory Committee (PEAC) to commence in November 2018. The Board will approve membership terms, as required. There are currently five (5) positions available. (To check the respective areas that schools are in use our school locator.)

- B. York Region District School Board invites one (1) community member from any part of the region to participate as an advisor for a term of up to four (4) years.
 - Regional ONE Position Not required to have child/ren in school

PEAC supports encourages and enhances parent engagement at the Board level in order to improve student achievement and well-being. PEAC does this by providing information and advice on parent engagement to the Board, communicating with and supporting school councils and undertaking activities to help parents support their children's learning. The Committee's mandate is to:

- a) develop strategies and initiatives that the Board and the Board's Director of Education could use to effectively communicate with parents/guardians and to effectively engage parents/guardians in improving student achievement and well-being.
- b) advise the Board and the Director of Education on ways to use the strategies and initiatives referred to above.
- c) communicate information from the Ministry to school councils of schools of the Board and to parents/guardians of pupils of the Board.
- d) work with school councils of schools of the Board and, through the Board's Director of Education, with employees of the Board to;

- i. share effective practices to help engage parents/guardians, especially parents/guardians who may find engagement challenging, in their children's learning.
- ii. identify and reduce barriers to parent engagement.
- iii. help ensure that schools of the Board create a welcoming environment for parents/guardians of its pupils.
- iv. develop skills and acquire knowledge that will assist the Parent, Family and Community Engagement Advisory Committee and school councils of the Board with their work.

e) determine, in consultation with the Board's Director of Education and in keeping with the Board's policies and procedures, how funding, if any, provided under the Education Act for parent involvement is reported.

The Parent, Family and Community Engagement Committee (PEAC) is established according to Ministry legislation and members must be prepared to attend each meeting. PEAC meetings are generally scheduled on the second Tuesday of the month. Members are required to attend a minimum of six meetings and will have opportunities to participate in other workshops and events. The first meeting date for the new membership is November 13, 2018.

PEAC is composed of:

- 12 parents/guardians (2 Elementary and 1 Secondary for each Community Education Center)
- 1 Director of Education or Designate
- 1 Trustee and 1 alternate
- 1 Special Education Advisory Committee member
- 1 Equity and Inclusivity Advisory Committee member
- 1 Community Member at Large

Members are selected based on principles of representation that include diversity in all its manifestations, a variety of skills, experiences, location and knowledge. The contents of the Membership Applications are kept strictly confidential.

Two references are required, one of whom should be any YRDSB staff member. Parents/guardians who are also employees of the Board are asked to self-identify when applying. References are kept strictly confidential.
