## Guidance

### **Warm Weather Attire:**

With the return of warm weather, please take some time to review the appropriate attire policy with your son or daughter. Items that apply specifically for warm weather include:

- Shorts must be mid-thigh in length
- Shirts must meet bottoms (no bare midriff)
- Tank tops must have wide straps.

Please remember that Bur Oak is a place of where students come each day to learn, work and participate in school life. Appropriate attire formalizes the learning environment and promotes a positive and respectful tone for all members of the school community.

### **E-Learning Summer School**

Summer school courses are also available in an E learning format. These courses are generally at the grade 11 and 12 levels. Students need to make a Guidance appointment to receive the paper part of the application. This will ensure that Guidance is aware that the student has signed up online. There is a \$20 fee for the application and this is paid as part of the online application. - Reinforcement (2 weeks)—usually for students who were not successful in their first attempt

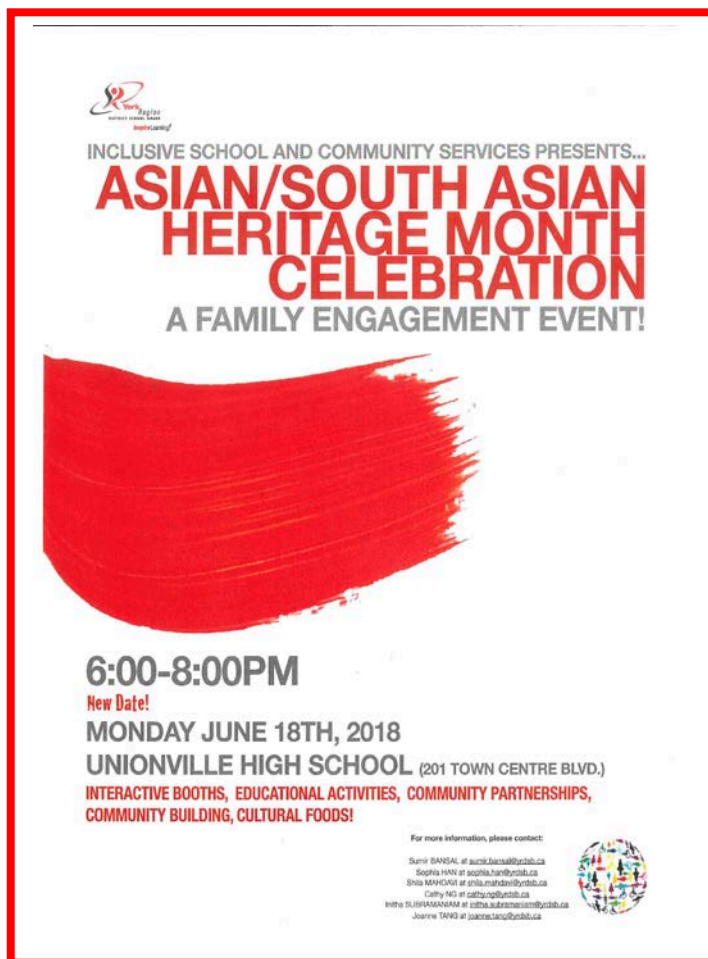
### **Playground Safety**

This is a reminder for all students that concerns have been raised by community members about BOSS student behaviour, especially in Wismer Park. We would like to remind all students that appropriate behaviour and language is expected especially off property so that everyone can enjoy public spaces and feel safe and welcomed. We know that BOSS students will represent themselves and our school in a positive and respectful manner.

We ask that parents remind their children to use the playground equipment at Wismer Park appropriately and to behave in a manner that creates a safe play area for all community members.

### **After School Protocol**

All students must leave school by 3:30 unless under the direct supervision of a teacher. The school is **not open on week-ends**. Students looking for a place to meet to work together are encouraged to use the Public Library.



## Arrivals and Departures

Parents/guardians who **drive their children to school** are reminded to follow the directional signs and use the designated areas for drop off and pick up. Please do not park in the bus / emergency zones and remember that there are no U-turns allowed in the front driveway.

**Students who drive to school** are reminded that use of the school parking lot is a privilege not a right. Students are expected to drive in accordance with provincial laws. All students are reminded that extreme caution must be used when driving in the school parking lot. Any student who drives carelessly or puts any student, staff member or community member at risk will lose their privilege to use the school parking lot. Parents/Guardians will be contacted and York Regional Police may also be notified.

Students may park in **designated areas** only in the south parking lot at the back of the school. Parking is not allowed in the Emergency Vehicles/Bus Route. To be eligible to use the lot, **students must**

- have a valid student card
- register their car at the office and obtain a parking permit. NOTE: Registration does not guarantee a parking spot.

Students who fail to comply with the parking regulations may:

- be towed at a substantial cost to the owner
- face a "drop" fee (once car is hooked to be towed)
- be ticketed (by the Town of Markham).

### **Mon Sheong Golden Jubilee Scholarship**

This scholarship is presented annually to students who demonstrate well-rounded excellence and desire to make real change—whether in their communities or around the world. Applicants are considered for academic standing, voluntary community involvement, leadership, character, and aspirations to make a difference.

This year there will be 3 recipients for the Mon Sheong Golden Jubilee Scholarship. Each recipient will receive \$1,000 per year for the duration of their studies, up to a maximum of 4 years (subject to renewal requirements).

1. Graduating from a Canadian high school or CEGEP with a minimum average of 80% among their top 6 grade 12 or CEGEP marks

3. Aspiring to have an even greater impact through their education and experience.
