# Diploma Requirements (O.S.S.D.)



## **Graduation Requirements**

#### 18 compulsory credits

Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma:

	credits in English (1 credit per grade)*
3	Grade 11 or 12)
2	credits in science
1	credit in Canadian history
1	credit in Canadian geography
1	credit in the arts
1	credit in health and physical education
1	credit in French as a second language
0.5	credit in career studies
0.5	credit in civics

1	12 optional credits*
1	40 hours of community involvement activities
1	the provincial literacy requirement

\* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

\*\* In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.

\*\*\* A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits.

\* The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.

## Academic (D)

larger class sizes (29)

 students may be expected to work more independently in class and complete homework to reinforce content in lessons

# English and Science skills?



- Important to have a SOLID FOUNDATION of skills to be more successful in the next step
- Choose carefully using grade 9 marks as part of the decision making (usually Level 3)
- Teacher recommendation is important
- Speak with a **counsellor** to consider different combinations and pathways



**Changing Levels?** Please speak with your Science or English teacher and/or guidance counsellor.

# Summer School

 Designed for students who have failed a course in Grade 9 and need to recover it--2 weeks in July

OR there may be a recommendation that you repeat the whole course (need to repeat at BOSS)

- Other courses taken at summer school must be <u>pre-approved</u> by the Guidance Department and the Principal
