GRADUATION AWARDS

There will be many awards for our graduates at our Graduation Ceremony to recognize the achievement and contributions of the Grade 12 class. The recipients of these awards will be determined by a panel of teachers and school staff. As part of our selection process we invite graduating students to self-nominate for up to <u>3 Graduation Awards</u>. All self-nominations must be received by <u>3 p.m. on Wednesday, April 2, 2025</u> to be considered. Please note, self-nominations are only part of the selection process. Staff nominations will also be considered.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> All award applications will be considered equally based on the criteria of each award. However, students who have full timetables (3 or more courses per semester) may be given preference in award selection as they have maintained their "full time status" as a student at BOSS. This was messaged to all students who chose to go through the part time status request process throughout the year.
