
Browse by Category (Click on a program to demonstrate)

- → Alphabetical listing of types of courses, specific course types and number offered in Ontario (it will show you how many programs)
- → Next level shows program name (i.e.: Arts and Humanities)
- → Visit program to find **OVERVIEW**, **REQUIREMENTS** (including language proficiency), **ADMISSION** and **CONTACT** information
- → Link to **UNIVERSITY WEBSITE** (look for Future Students and International Students)and
- → Link to **PROGRAM WEBSITE**


- Collaborative University and College Programs--VERY INTERESTING! (diploma and degree earned)

- Look for examples such as the Centennial College/U of T option for a paramedicine degree
- Ontario Postsecondary Transfer Guide
- Note: Seneca and U of T Scarborough created the first Bachelor of Science Pathway in Ontario Under the <u>transfer agreement</u>, graduates of Seneca's new <u>Arts and Science program</u> who meet certain admission requirements will be able to enrol in courses at UTSC, leading them to receive both a Seneca diploma and a University of Toronto Honours Bachelor of Science degree in four years.



 - Overview Section? (Program summary)
 - Requirements? (includes language requirements--often links to more information)
 - Admissions?
 - Contact information?
- 2. Critical Questions to consider: Why might a student need to use either of these links?
 - University Website
 - Program website

Star rating system—show my top rating

Compare—save your choices for later; show my comparisons

Applications for Degree Programs through the universities and colleges require:

Student has graduated and has six grade 12U or 12M courses for eligibility

- Includes English ENG4U
- May include other prerequisites in which a final mark is above a stated average mark
- Will require an overall average--with or without prerequisites
- Are done through Ontario University Application Centre (OUAC) and require a PIN provided through the school
- Timelines for application and supplementary applications must be adhered to
- Final marks by end of June to maintain Conditional Offers
