#### **Full Disclosure**

Full Disclosure is the term used to identify when courses will remain as "Withdrawn" on a student's transcript. This year, Full Disclosure will take place by November 29, 2023. This only impacts grade 11 and 12 courses.

Grade 11 students must continue to maintain <u>four full credits</u> this semester. Removing courses must meet specific criteria and are typically only approved by administration in unusual circumstances.

Grade 12 students will have their mid-semester marks submitted to OUAC and OCAS on November 17th. All marks for courses that are active will be uploaded at that time.

Between November 16 and November 29, any approved dropped courses will be removed from their timetable, transcript <u>AND</u> OUAC and OCAS by the Guidance Department. This encourages students to get a fuller sense of their grasp of content and hopefully achieve success in their courses this semester. While November 29 is the entry deadline, it is critical that any drop requests take place the week prior to ensure appointments can be taken and all sign-offs are completed properly.

Please note, grade 11 students and grade 12 students who are not graduating do not have any data shared to outside application centres.

# Grade 12 students should consider the following steps when considering a drop request:

- \*Have student discuss with their teacher a plan to successfully meet their academic goals in the course
- \*Get the facts from Post-Secondary Institutions to feel comfortable about the weight and significance of their mid-semester marks for this year's admissions process.
- \*Speak with their Guidance Counsellor to feel comfortable and build a plan about their goals for this year and get perspective on what may work best for them.

#### **Course Change Requests For Semester Two**

Students wishing to request changes to courses for semester two will have the opportunity to speak with guidance counsellors during the week of November 27 and December 4. Course change requests are very unlikely at this time as our classes are full.

#### **Grade 11 and 12 Graduation Status Check-ins**

During the week of November 20th, guidance counsellors will be visiting grade 11 & 12 classes to review student's graduation status. At this time we will check about credits earned, OSSLT completion, Community Involvement hours and ensuring students have completed or planned for all necessary graduation requirements.

This is a sample of <u>questions and answers</u> from previous sessions.

What information is in Teach Assist?	Student Marks for tests and assignments are on Teach Assist. The student's list of courses for the
Can parents access the Google Class-	Yes! Parents can email the teachers and ask to be invited to the Google Classroom.
How can students get extra help, other than asking the teacher?	There are many ways to get extra help. For immediate concerns, student can go to Guidance. They can also register for Peer Tutoring, they can meet with the Student Success Teacher or if they have an IEP they can speak with their Special Education Resource Teacher.
What does it mean that Bur Oak is a 1:1 school?	This means that the expectation is that every student will bring their own device to school to complete their class work. Bur Oak has loaner laptops that students can borrow for the year (like a textbook) and return it at the end of the year.
What is EQAO for Math?	The Ministry of Ontario requires that Grade 9 students complete a standardized math text. This test occurs at the end of the semester and makes up 5% of their overall mark. This test is in addition to the final examination for their Math Course.
Do they have to pass the EQAO Math test to graduate?	No, the EQAO Math test is not a graduation requirement.
Does my child have to take Grade 12	No, students only need 3 Math credits to graduate.
How can my son register for Arabic if it's not offered at this school?	He can register through My Blueprint. Language courses are offered through the Indigenous Languages and International Languages program.
How can my daughter try out for soccer?	She should listen for the announcements in the early spring. The coach will announce an information session for soccer try-outs. She can also check the bulletin board beside the Phys Ed office for information.

#### 3 R's at Bur Oak Secondary School

# 3Rs - Respect, Responsibility, Relationships

#### As Bulldogs, we:

- Are respectful, take responsibility and leave things better than we found it, and build positive and healthy relationships.
- Stand quietly during the playing of the National Anthem. If we arrive late to school, we stand
  quietly during the National Anthem and walk quietly to period 1 class during the morning
  announcements.
- Eat lunch in the cafeteria or in the first floor atrium during our lunch period 2, 3, or 4. We pick
  up after ourselves.
- Do not eat nor sit in the first floor hallways and we do not eat nor sit in the second floor hallways. We are not in the stairwells and we do not wander the hallways. We are respectful for classes in session.
- Do not congregate nor hang out in washrooms. We maintain a welcoming and safe school
  environment for students to use the washroom. We understand that nobody should feel
  intimidated in any parts of the school building.
- Use the first floor atrium tables for quiet study. We sit on chairs. We do not sit on top of the table and we do not lie down on tables or the floor.
- Wear earbuds for music in the hallways and atrium. We respect the environment of others by not using loud speakers.
- Dress appropriately for school.
- Ask our teacher for permission to leave the classroom to use the washroom or get a drink of water. We sign out to leave the classroom and sign in when we return to the classroom.
