1. Introduction

 - Mr. Douglas comes in 2 days/week to work with Grade 7 and 8 students
 - The artwork is planned to be displayed outside the office in the windows facing out
 - Will invite the families and community members to take a walk through
 - In 2 weeks it will be a sharing week where he will share more stories
 - Cost covered by School Board and Ontario Art Council funding
- Minutes of last meeting (January 19th, 2023) were approved

2. School News

- a) Board Literacy Theme Regional Itinerant Primary Literacy (RIPL) Team
 - Focus on JK/SK/Grade 1 teachers
 - 2-week program between April 3rd and April 14th
- b) Provincial Testing (EQAO and PCAP)
 - Education Quality and Accountability Office Grade 3 and Grade 6 students will be writing it online during the first week of June (4 language and 4 math parts)
 - Pan Canadian Assessment Program (PCAP) will be written by Ms. Waldman's Grade 8 students (the week before the grad trip)
- c) Schoolwide Campaign for April is Neurodiversity
 - Celebrating our uniqueness
 - Partnering with Holland-Bloorview
 - 2 week stretch challenging classes with exploring neuro- and physical-diversities
- d) Spirit Wear (April Launch)
 - Fashion Show in April with new bulldog logo
 - Found a new local vendor
 - Proceeds will go towards athletic jerseys for students
- e) Staffing Allocation
 - 19 homeroom classrooms have been allocated for the new year (as of now)

- Number of student enrollment continues to increase (currently ~475 students)
- De-streaming in elementary schools Ministry has asked schools to review special education program and to consider reintegrating students into the mainstream classroom
- Class placements process begins at the end of May/beginning of June
- f) Every Student Counts Survey (conducted once every 4 years)
 - An opportunity to share your voice what is your vision for education?
 - Grades 4-8 will complete the survey during school hours
 - JK-grade 3 will be competed at home

g) Graduation Trip

- Grade 8 students will be going to Muskoka (May 8-10)
- Cost is \$480/student
- School Council to contribute \$2000 for the graduation trip

h) Other Items:

- Scholastic Book Fair (week of May 29th)
- Buttonville Chess Tournament between April 11th and 21st students who win will compete in interschool competition competing against 12-18 schools
- Track & Field Day (early June)
- Graduation Ceremony (June 22nd)
- Sports Club starting up (baseball, pickleball, etc.)

3. School Council Updates

a) Food

- Ambiyan: ~50-70 orders/week (not as successful as other vendors as younger kids are not familiar with the spices)
- Booster Juice: big hit with students. They also offer a wrap option (in case we want to offer in the future)
- Subway: experiencing on-time service issues due to vendor coming in from Woodbridge
- Popcorn is now changed from bi-weekly to a weekly offering
- Cotton Candy was a great success (collected \$1400) which was sold over 2 days
- Vivo Pizza and Pasta: looking to offer a trial for 2 Mondays (April 24th and May 1st) Council voted YES (~120 gram per meal)
 - Penne with Butter: Cost \$4.20 (Selling Price: \$5.50)
 - Mac & Cheese: Cost \$5.88 (Selling Price: \$7.00)
 - Penne Pomodoro: Cost \$5.60 (Selling Price: \$7.00)
 - o Rigatoni Bolognese: Cost \$7.56 (Selling Price: \$8.75)

b) Survey

School Council to issue a survey to the families of Buttonville on the lunch program. Potential questions to ask include:

- Do you like the variety of food offered?

- Do you like the vendors?
- How do you find the Healthy Hunger platform?

c) Treasurer's Report

- Beginning of the year \$9,608
- As of March 22nd \$17,267 (\$3,003 lunches, \$2,449 karate, \$1,296 popcorn and cotton candy sales, \$459 poinsettia, \$176 spirit wear and \$147 from Winter Concert hot chocolate sales)
- Karate was a great success for next year consider offering other types of activities i.e., yoga/dance etc.

d) Concerts

- Winter Arts concert was a great success
- For future concerts need to remind audience to stay until the end and encourage students
- For future, sales should be conducted before and after the concert and during break times if offered
- As school population increases, could consider doing the concert over 2 days
- Suggestions for Family Festive Night:
 - o Can we do a parent sing along during the concert?
 - o Order extra poinsettias and allow families to buy on the day of the concert

e) Grandparents Tea/Volunteer Appreciation/Big Box of Cards/Book Fair

- Grandparents Tea/Volunteer Appreciation to be held on Thursday, June 1st at 11am
- Sign up sheet for baked goods brought in by Council members and teachers
- Students will perform followed by students taking grandparents to show their classes
- Will need to send out a letter for RSVP to get an idea of number of people who will be attending
- Big Box of Cards will be sold for cash only in the library during the week of the Book Fair (May 29th)
- Will be requesting 250 boxes (if refundable) or 200 boxes (if not refundable) of Birthday card selection
- Cost is \$24/box (Selling Price: \$35/box that consists of 35 cards)
- Connie to discuss with vendor and confirm the details

f) Fall Fair

- Will not be doing the BBQ in June due to time constraints but will offer it during the Fall Fair in early October
- To coincide with Meet the Teacher/Curriculum Night
- Could consider having food trucks/music for food trucks will need at least 3 food trucks
 plus other vendors i.e., ice cream, bubble tea etc.
