- Use 5 descriptive words (adjectives) to paint a word picture of something you saw today.
- Would you want to live there?
- Why or why not?



SUMMER DRESS CODE, SUN PROTECTION, HEAT STRESS AND HOT WEATHER

Spring has finally sprung! As the weather gets warmer we would like to take this opportunity to ask parents to review the Castlemore P.S. dress code with their children. The dress code is outlined in the Student Agenda and on our website the School Handbook section. Please make sure that students come to school with proper sun protection (i.e. hat) and wear sunscreen to avoid overexposure to the sun.



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"Most kids rack up between 50% and 80% of their life-time sun exposure before age 18, so it's important that parents teach their children how to enjoy fun in the sun safely. With the right precautions, you can greatly reduce your child's chance of developing skin cancer.

The majority of heat-related illnesses; fainting, heat cramps, and heat exhaustion are considered minor. Although not life-threatening like heat stroke, they are, none-the-less, important illnesses:

Heat-related fainting— dizziness, fatigue and irritability; lack of concentration, loss of the ability to make rational decisions

Heat-related cramps— painful arm, leg or stomach, muscle spasms; thirst and heavy sweating Heat exhaustion— heat-related fainting symptoms plus loss of coordination, collapse

Student Bussing Eligibility

Did you know that students' bussing eligibility changes throughout their school career? Your son/daughter's eligibility to ride the school bus may change according to their grade and distance from home to school. Below are the provisions for eligibility identified in the Board's Transportation Policy #680:

All YRDSB students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are **not** eligible for transportation

Bussing is not provided for any grade 4 - 8 Castlemore students.

Welcome to Castlemore P.S. for the 2017-2018 School Year!

The following information should answer questions concerning your child's first day of school on Tuesday, Sept. 5/17, at Castlemore.

Classes for Grade SK to 8 students begin Tuesday, September 5th at 8:30 a.m. Please plan to arrive by 8:15 a.m.

Due to the unknown number of registrations that will be received between now and Sept. 5th, class and teacher names are not released until 8:25 am on the first day of school.

Staff will greet students on our school yard and will direct them to find their grade sign on the school windows. When the bell rings, homeroom teachers will call out the names of students in their class, say goodbye to parents, and take their class into the school building.

Should it be raining, staff will be posted at entrance doors to direct students.

Our Office closes on Thurs., June 29th and reopens on Monday, August 29th.

Should you or your child be anxious about school, please feel free to accompany your child on a self-guided visit on Tues., Aug. 30th or Wed., Aug. 31st, 10:00 a.m. -> noon. Please sign in and out at the office.

Should you have outstanding Registration Paperwork – please visit us on Tues., Aug. 29th or Wed., Aug. 30th, 10:00 a.m. –> noon to complete your child's file.

If you are moving your child to another school for Sept., and have not already advised our office, please call the school before June 29th or during the week of August 29th to let us know.

Should you be still on vacation on September 5th, you need to contact our office in writing during the last week of August to explain your child's absence. Unfortunately, space cannot be saved for students who are not starting school on Sept. 5th^d, without this written notification.

VOLUNTEERS in OUR SCHOOL

The York Region Board of Education welcomes the use of volunteers in all schools. A volunteer is an individual who agrees to undertake, without pay, a designated task that supports a classroom, school or system-wide program, under the ultimate responsibility of the principal.

Volunteers shall not be involved in the evaluation of students, school personnel or program. Volunteers must maintain confidentiality with respect to personal information regarding students, their families, or staff, except as required to perform their duties and maintain staff and student safety.

A York Region Police Vulnerable Sector Check (PVSC) is required for all individuals who work or volunteer in the school system.

New Volunteers must submit a York Region PVSC, completed within the last six months.

To obtain a PVSC, you must:

- Be a permanent resident of York Region and supply two pieces of government-issued identification, which must confirm your name, date of birth and address, and one piece of government identification that includes a photo
- Obtain a Letter of Introduction from the School Office, which will discount the fee charged for this service
- Fill out Unit 1 of Form YRP149 Application for Police Vulnerable Sector Check
- Go to the YRPD Customer Resource Centre shown below:

Once payment has been confirmed and the application submitted, a Customer Service Representative will begin to complete the request. You will receive an email to attend the Resource Centre when the check is completed. You must personally pick up your PVSC and will be required to show identification and proof of residency to obtain your PVSC.

You should then submit your PVSC, your Volunteer Preference Form and the Confidentiality Form to the School Office. If you will be driving students to/from Athletic Activities, etc. you will also submit a Trip Driver Authorization Form.

Returning Volunteers must sign an Annual Offence Declaration and new Preference, Confidentiality and Driver Authorization Forms annually.


HEALTHY SCHOOLS
