From the Administrative Team:


We are so excited to have started off the new year with so much success! With the support and dedication of our staff, school council and parent community, classroom structures have been set up and routines have been established. In all grades, meaningful instruction is well underway and evident in all classrooms. We appreciate the support that was put into place by staff members and families to ensure that student transitions went smoothly as we reorganized some of our classes last month.

Community engagement is a key aspect to ensuring student success and well-being. We were quite pleased to see the large number of parents and/or guardians at our School Council last month. We look forward to welcoming families on October 13th to our Curriculum Night, between 6:30 and 8:00. The format for the evening will include formal presentations made by classroom teachers, repeated in two different time slots, at 6:45 and again at 7:15. The repeated sessions are designed to allow a parent to attend two different classroom presentations, if needed. We will also have a technology presentation for parents in the library at 6:45, if you are interested in learning more about the classroom use of tools such as Google Classroom. Individual classroom teachers will also be able to speak to you about their use of technology in the classes. At our curriculum night, we will also have information available to parents about YRDSB free English as a Second Language, Computer Training and Skills Upgrading Courses in the community, presented by the Adult ESL and Literacy Basic Skills (iWin) Program.

The 2015-2016 EQAO school results have been released to the public. The results below indicate the percentage of all students who were in grade 3 or 6 last year achieving at or above the provincial standard. We are very pleased with our school-based results. Individual student reports have been sent home. As a staff, we will be analyzing the individual and group results in order to set new school targets towards continued student achievement. We will be further discussing our school and Board results, and our focus for school improvement planning at our next School Council meeting on November 3rd, at 6:30. Punctuality is Important!



Punctuality is a life-skill that is valued by school, employers in the workforce, and society. The bell rings at 8:25 a.m. at Castlemore P.S. and classes begin at 8:30 a.m. Students are expected to be in class by the beginning of our opening exercises.

- Supervision outside begins at 8:15 a.m. and students start lining up to enter the building at 8:25 a.m.
- Students must enter using their classroom designated doors.
- Help your child start each school day ready to learn!

The office monitors occurrences of student absences and lates. The office can support students who are repeatedly late by providing their families with a plan to help ensure timely arrival at school.

Dropping Off and Picking Up Children at School

Our Kiss and Ride area works best when everyone follows the routine. There are two lanes in the Kiss and Ride area. Vehicles will only be allowed to enter the area using the Kiss and Ride lane. Pylons will block the entrance to the other lane. Please pull up to the top of the Kiss and Ride lane so that utilization of this space is optimized. The Kiss and Ride area can hold up to ten vehicles at one time. Vehicle occupants are to exit vehicles on the sidewalk side only. The designated Passing Lane can only be used once your child has entered or exited your vehicle, and you are ready to drive away. There is no parking at any time in this area as it is reserved for emergency vehicles. PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE YOUR CAR UNATTENDED. Please avoid idling your car. If you need to walk your child into the school, then please park on the street. Please remind your children that they should be looking for your car at the end of the day. This area is always very busy so please be sure to be on the lookout for pedestrians. Please consider walking to school as an eco-friendly, healthier alternative to driving to school.

Parents who pick up their children near the Kiss and Ride doors are asked to wait outside for their children, and at a distance from the doors. This practice will provide a safe exit for the students. To ensure the safety of all children, we ask that parents drop off or meet children outside their designated entry/exit doors. Our school grounds are supervised by our staff beginning at 8:15 a.m..

Reminder: Parents/Caregivers — school dismisses at 3 p.m. Parents/guardians are encouraged to set a meeting location with their child(ren) so that pick up may proceed smoothly. Please arrive on time to pick up your child(ren). Children feel anxious when they are last to be picked up.

Severe Allergies—Anaphylaxis



Some allergies can be quite severe, such as anaphylaxis. An anaphylactic reaction can be life -threating. In response to the fact that students with severe allergies attend school, a plan is being developed to ensure safe learning environments for these students. One way to help promote safe learning environments is to avoid bringing nut products to school (e.g., peanut butter, products containing nuts like biscuits). Please do not send any food items containing peanuts, tree nuts, or nut products. Another way is for families to speak to their child(ren) and reinforce the message around not sharing food or taking food from others; the children are to eat only the food items sent to school by their families.

Families with a child (or children) who rely on an EpiPen are asked to provide the office with one EpiPen which will be kept in the main office health room. Please arrange to also have your child wear an EpiPen. Please note that parent signature is no longer required to authorize staff administration of EpiPens.





Medication



Families are asked to let the office know whenever they are sending medication to school with their child. The school requires that families complete a medication plan - available in the school office - whenever their child(ren) need(s) to take medication during school hours (e.g., a dose of antibiotics). The medication will be kept safe in the office, and returned to the student at the end of the day. Please ensure that the child's name and dosage regimen are noted on the medication itself (e.g., pharmacy prescription bottle with child's name and dosage information). Please note that maximal responsibility is placed on the student for the administration of medication.

Keeping Students Safe

Student safety is a high priority at Castlemore PS. We make efforts to follow all school board policies and procedures relating to student safety (e.g., student code of conduct, fire alarm drills). One important part of keeping students safe is the activation of procedures linked to student threats of violence. Families should have recently received a brochure "Student Threat Assessment and Intervention" which outlines how the school addresses student threats.

The key messages found in the brochure are:

- 1. The school takes student threats of violence seriously.
- 2. School administrators may access student lockers during the student threat assessment process without consent.
- 3. Parental/student consent is not required when there is a risk that someone may be harmed.
- 4. A multi-disciplinary team will carry out an assessment of the threat. Members of this team include a school administrator, a school social worker and/or YRDSB Psychological Services member, or YRP police officer, and/or school personnel who know the student well.
- 5. The brochure serves as "fair notice" that any report of a threat to harm others will be investigated.



Halloween News



Halloween is celebrated by some of the Castlemore PS students.

According to the province's Safe School legislation, families and students are reminded that they are to avoid bringing any toy replicas resembling guns, knives, axes, swords, or any other weapon, to school. These items are sometimes included as accessories to Halloween costumes. Please keep these items at home. Families and students are also asked to avoid other costume accessories such as fake blood and vampire teeth since these items may create a sense of fear among some students. Should any of these items be discovered at school, they will be held in the office and returned to students at the end of the school day.



In addition, following Halloween, we ask families to refrain from having their child(ren) bring candies to school. These candies may contain nuts, peanuts or other allergens. It is good practice to check the ingredients of any snack carefully before sending it to school with your child. We appreciate your understanding.
