
We continue our focus on Mathematics this year here at Charlton. Our Gr. 4, 5 and 6 teachers are working with teachers from 2 other neighbouring schools in a 'mini-network', in which groups of teachers create, deliver and debrief lessons given to students to aid in their learning. We are following a similar system in all Divisions at Charlton in order to increase our teachers' collective awareness of effective programming and instructional delivery in mathematics. This process allows us to improve our instruction as a school. In improving our instruction, our ultimate goal is to improve student achievement.

Doing Math with your Child—Top Tips for Parents

You can aid us in our quest for increased student achievement in Mathematics by following these top tips:

- Build strong, positive attitudes about math. When children feel positively engaged and successful, they are more likely to stick with an activity or a problem to find a solution.
- Begin with activities that meet your child's level of mathematical understanding. Early success in solving problems will build your

- child's confidence. Gradually move to activities that provide more challenge for your child.
- If you and your child are more comfortable in a language other than English, use it.
 Your child will understand concepts better in the language that he or she knows best.

At about 2 pm the entire student population helps to pick up trash that has been deposited/blown on the school property (weather permitting). The Senior grades help to clean up the 'ditch' where a lot of this garbage ends up. Students are given plastic gloves and garbage bags to help in their cleanup. We make a point of letting students know that they must not touch any glass, sharp cans or anything that looks dangerous.

We usually collect about 15-20 bags of garbage from our yard, which benefits our students as well as the community. Students learn respect for the environment and how important it is for us to live and play in clean spaces.
