

Anaphylactic Reactions

At the January 26, 2006 Board Meeting, the Board of Trustees approved the new Anaphylactic Reactions Policy. This can be accessed on the Board's internet site at www.yrdsb.edu.on.ca. Select "Your Trustees" and then "Policies and By-laws." All students are to carry or wear the epipen on them at school. If parents indicate they do not wish for their child to do so, a letter will be sent home indicating parents have refused to follow the policy. The school and staff must still abide by the Board and School policy despite parents' refusal.

In addition, parents of students with anaphylaxis may also wish to contact the Canadian MedicAlert® Foundation. MedicAlert® is Canada's largest member-based, charity organization dedicated to providing services that protect and save lives. Literacy Corner

Free Online tutoring sessions for Intermediate students can help!

PROMOTING AND SUPPORTING MATH AND LANGUAGE LITERACY ONLINE!

Over 236,000 grade 7 to 10 math students now have access to live, interactive online math help through the expansion of a pilot project funded by the Ministry of Education. <u>Homework Help</u> is free, real-time math tutoring by certified Ontario teachers. Please visit https://homeworkhelp.ilc.org/

Students can log in from Sunday to Thursday, 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. EST for 20 hours a week of individualized confidential math tutoring. There are discussion rooms for each grade where students can join in and see what questions other students are asking, watch the tutors draw on the whiteboard – and ask their own question for on-the-spot help.

How the Program can benefit your child:

- 1. If they can't wait until the discussion rooms open, videos of best tutorials and commonly asked questions are available any time. Other online math resources include math games and a virtual locker, where students can save their work. We provide help with understanding math homework when students are outside of the school environment.
- 2. The chat room allows them to ask questions in a safe, anonymous environment.
- 3. Tutor strategies build on their strengths and skills to help them gain confidence and proficiency. They will bring this new confidence and understanding back to the classroom.
- 4. The queue allows them to watch the questions posed by their peers. This provides them with another opportunity for learning and emphasizes that everyone has questions, and its okay to ask for help.
- 5. Creates a safety net for students outside of the classroom, allowing them to challenge themselves with the knowledge that they can get help if they need it.

Site resources are available 24/7, enabling students to develop new numeracy skills at any time of day or night. For more information visit
