York Region consistently scores higher than the provincial average in Mathematics, Reading and Writing. Charlton consistently scores higher than both the provincial average and the York Region average. Early indicators are telling us that this year's results reflect the same

trend as we've seen in the past 5 years. This space is not large enough for me to give all the reasons why I believe this to be true.

However, I will say that one of the main reasons for our success is the quality of our staff. Charlton staff members are continually learning and implementing proven techniques to maximize the success of our students. Despite an ESL population that exceeds 40% of our student population, students are made to feel welcome im-

Primary Class Size Reduction

As a result of a Provincial law limiting the size of Primary classes (Kdg to Gr. 3), all schools must look at their enrolment as of September 20th, and make an adjustment, if necessary, to comply with the law. This may mean that new classes are formed, classes are cancelled, or more likely

some students move from one class to another.
Though this is an adjustment for students, the curriculum they follow will remain consistent, and parents know that our youngest students are in class sizes that allow teachers to give them personalized attention in some of the most important years

of their educational careers.
