Parents who accompany their children to and from school are asked to determine a meeting place outside of the school building. This helps to minimize congestion in the halls and avoid the risk of contact with strangers. We greatly appreciate your help with these important procedures.

This on-line teaching tool allows students to watch demonstrations of singing, instrumental accompaniments and dances to various songs. Students learn the words to the song, rhythmic patterns to play and dances that match the music.

MUSICPLAY supports the playing of Orff instruments, recorders, guitar, piano and boomwhackers.

Our primary and junior students participate in this program which helps prepare them for instrumental music in the intermediate grades.

### Electricity Safety & Conservation Presentations - March 10, 2020


Presenters from Newmarket Hydro will be visiting Clearmeadow PS on Tuesday, March 10th to teach our students about both electrical safety and conservation. Primary students will meet 'Wires' the safety puppet and engage in some hands on activities to help develop their understanding. The junior and intermediate presentations focus on electrical hazards at home, dangers at electrical substations and car accidents involving power lines and poles. Students will learn why it is important not to be negatively pressured by peers and some of the serious accidents that can happen when unsafe decisions are made. Energy costs and conservation will also be explored throughout these presentations. We would like to express our appreciation to Newmarket Hydro in partnering with us to help share safety messages with our students.

#### **INCLEMENT WEATHER & BUS CANCELLATIONS**

If buses are cancelled in the morning, they are **also cancelled for the afternoon.** For safety reasons, you may choose whether or not to send your child to school. However, **if you bring your child to school you will need to pick them up at 3:20 pm dismissal time**. If you choose to keep your child who **normally walks** to school home for the day, **you MUST call the school and report their absence**.

Our Safe Arrival Program dictates that we know where all absent students are – if we cannot reach you, we will contact your emergency contact person. If we cannot reach that person, we are obligated to contact the police.

Once students arrive, they are expected to stay at school. If you are planning to pick up your child during the lunch hour please make arrangements ahead of time.

#### When buses are cancelled:

NO Lunch Lady - Please send a lunch with your child NO Special Events - Presentations & field trips rescheduled Our school remains open. There may be a modified program in your child's class due to numbers of students attending and absences of some teachers. Dress for the weather – bus cancellation does not mean automatic indoor recesses or early entry into the school.

Make arrangements for transport of your child at end of day - if you have driven your child to school due to the buses being cancelled, remember they need to be picked up at 3:20 pm.



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
