Top 5 Reasons to Harvest Rainwater:

1. Use rainwater to grow healthy and lush plants
2. Reduce water bills and conserve vital natural resource
3. Control moisture levels around house foundation
4. Protect rivers, streams & ponds from runoff pollution
5. Divert water from municipal storm drain system

How Do Rain Barrels Work?

1. Rain falls through downspout from the rooftop and enters the rain barrel through the mosquito screen and filter.
2. When ready to use the captured rainwater, simply turn the spigot at the bottom to open the tap.
3. If the barrel fills completely, excess water can escape and travel away from the barrel through the overflow hose.

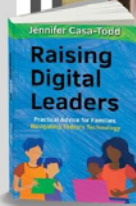
