

AT A GLANCE INFORMATION


As we continue to learn together all of the new health and safety protocols to keep our students and staff safe, we have a few reminders for parents to review with their child(ren).

- Students must come to school with a snack and a lunch. No lunch deliveries can be accepted. This includes parents dropping off a packed lunch.
- Students in Grades 4-8 must wear a mask while in the building, but may remove it to eat and when playing outside while maintaining physical distancing.
- Children need to dress for the weather as they will be participating in more outdoor learning.
- At the end of the day those children walking home should leave the property as soon as possible to help maintain social distancing.
- Free entry begins at 8:45 am. Students enter the school via their designated entry door as soon as they arrive and proceed directly to their classroom. There is no outdoor playtime before school begins. It is important that students arrive on time in the morning.
- Please try to make appointments outside of the school day. If an appointment is necessary during the day please let the school know in advance.






Walking or Cycling to School

As we start the 2020-2021 school year, we would like to remind and encourage families to consider **walking or cycling with children to and from school**. There are many benefits to walking and cycling to school. It:

Improves student academic performance by making children more alert and better prepared to learn.

Contributes to the daily goal of 60 minutes of moderate or vigorous activity for children, improving their health and overall fitness.

Reduces traffic congestion and improves safety for everyone in school zones.

Promotes life-long habits that foster independence and active lifestyles, preparing children for their future.

For those who can't walk or cycle to school every day, choosing active travel once, twice or a few days a week can still provide benefits. You can also consider parking a block away from the school and walking the rest of the way. Include active travel as part of your daily routine.

INTERNATIONAL AND INDIGENOUS LANGUAGES REGISTRATION
