Cold and Flu Season

Winter is here and with it comes the cold and flu season. We are noticing an increasing number of students who are absent due to illness, or exhibiting symptoms while at school. Please read the important information below from York Region Public Health to help you know when to send your child back to school following a fever and/or nausea/vomiting/diarrhea. This helps all of our students, staff and families stay healthy!

The following information can be found on the Public Health website (https://www.ontario.ca/page/protection-covid-19-and-other-respiratory-illnesses):

- If you are sick, stay home to prevent transmission to others, except to seek testing or medical care if required.
- You should stay home until all of the following apply to you:
 - your symptoms have been improving for at least 24 hours (or 48 hours if you had nausea, vomiting and/or diarrhea, i.e. from the last time that you had any symptoms)
 - o you do not have a fever
 - o you do not develop any additional symptoms

CVPS is **Eco-Friendly!**



CVPS is working towards achieving an Ecoschool certification again this year! We would like to keep our Platinum Certification. Here is an update on our current initiatives:

1. **Battery collection pails** have been placed in the "front" area by the office main entrance and the library. Students can begin bringing in batteries. It is important to tape the 9V battery terminals to avoid fires.

2. Snack pouch collection bin is also in front of the library where ALL brands are being collected.

Writing Instrument Recycling Program

We would like to remind everyone that our school has a writing instrument recycling collection program courtesy of our School Council. Pens, markers and other writing instruments are not considered recyclable in our municipality but thanks to Terracycle and Staples, they can collect ANY writing instrument for proper recycling.

Classes will be collecting their unusable writing instruments and we're asking that families may also bring theirs in as well! Collection boxes will be in front of the library with our other (snack pouch and battery) eco-initiative recycling bins are.

Interesting tidbit: Through in-store collection at over 300 locations across Canada, Staples and Terracycle have successfully diverted over 2 million writing instruments from ending up in landfills. If all writing instruments recycled through this program were connected, they could travel up the CN Tower nearly 700 times! (Credit: Staples Canada)

Tips for Winter Walking

Walking to school in winter not only benefits student physical and mental health, well-being and academic performance, it's also fun!


Here are a few tips to help you stay safe and enjoy winter walks to school.

- 1. Dress for the weather. Wear layers. Don't forget your hat and mitts.
- 2. Protect your feet. Wear warm socks and winter boots. They will protect your feet from snow, rain and cold and have good grips.
- 3. Be visible. Wear bright clothes, stay on the sidewalks and make sure cars can see you when you cross the road.
- 4. Allow a little more time. Prepare your winter gear the night before and give yourself a little more time to walk to school.
- 5. Try walking like a penguin. It's fun and practical.
- 6. Enjoy the snow. Catch snowflakes, talk about what you love most about the winter.

7. Obey road signs. The seasons change but road safety rules remain. Stop at roads and crosswalks. Cross with a crossing guard where possible. Look out for cars.



Take some time and review winter dressing with your child.



If you are driving, please follow road rules. Remember that our school zones are busy with students and families. It is important that we all follow the rules to ensure student safety.

- Use the kiss and ride. Do not use dedicated bus lanes.
- Consider parking near the school and walking the rest of the way (obeying all neighbourhood parking rules).
- Obey all speed limits and road traffic signs in school zones.
- Focus on the road and watch for crossing guards and students crossing the road.

It's never too early to start to teach road safety. Your child will become a safe, responsible and independent pedestrian by experience and practice. Starting them as young as kindergarten will equip them with the skills they need to walk on their own in all seasons at an earlier age.

Important Winter Weather Reminders

With winter weather here, we want to share a few important reminders.

Dress for the weather

Students should come dressed appropriately for the weather and for outdoor play. Students
can stay warm by wearing layers of loose-fitting clothing, a hat, scarf, jackets, snow pants
and mittens or gloves. Students may also want to bring extra pants and socks in case they
get wet.

Recess

 If students are well enough to come to school, they are expected to go outside for recess. Our students benefit from spending time outside and being active. We monitor weather conditions throughout the day. If there are extreme weather conditions, we may consider a shortened or indoor recess.

Bus or School Cancellations

- When an extreme cold or inclement weather day is declared, school transportation (including buses and taxis) is cancelled in the morning and afternoon. Schools will remain open. Please notify the school if your child will not be attending school on those days.
 Students will not be penalized for missing school on these days.
- There may be rare instances when emergency weather events occur and we need to close all schools and Board locations. Please take the time to make plans in the event of an emergency school closure. Information about transportation cancellations and Board closures will be shared through local media, Board and school websites and on X @YRDSB.
- Our process for extreme cold, inclement weather and emergency weather days is outlined in the <u>Board's Severe Weather policy</u>.

Kindergarten Registration for the 2025-2026 School Year opens on Friday, January 17, 2025.

If your child was born in 2021, they are eligible to begin Kindergarten in September.

You may call the school office at (905) 471-1694 if you require assistance with the registration.

Once you have completed your application, the school will contact you to make an appointment to review and verify the <u>required documents</u>.
