Replicas and Knives Reminder

As spring approaches and our students begin playing outside again, we need to take the time to remind them that toy guns (or any replica weapon) and knives MUST NOT be brought to school. This includes any Swiss army, carving, or multi-purpose tools that contain knives. Realizing we use these tools frequently in our community for activities such as hunting, camping, and fishing, we must work harder to ensure our children understand that they cannot be brought to school. Your support and attention to this matter will help us avoid lengthy, mandatory suspensions.

Lates and Absences

Please take the time to review how many lates and/or absences your child(ren) have had during term one.

LATE

If your child has already missed 10+ days in one term this would be considered a

concern in terms of the possible negative impact on his/her learning. If a student misses 20+ days in one school year, research shows that a student could be in jeopardy of losing his/her credit (especially crucial in high school).

Lates are a big concern too. We have many students arriving at school anywhere from just a few minutes late - up to an hour late, for school in the morning. Often this is not because of any appointment or illness. The reasons given are often that the student/family slept in, or the student missed the bus or the student didn't want to take the bus and had to wait for a ride.

We remind parents and students that our day begins at 8:15 a.m. and we go straight into programming. If your child's day begins with Language, then he/she will miss the main literacy lesson of the day and all of the instructions for what is to happen during the 100 minute literacy block. He/she also misses collaboration and independent work time to complete tasks and comprehend their work. Lates not only impact the child who is late, but they can also impact other students. When a student interrupts the flow of the classroom by walking in late it can throw off the whole classroom. Please consider what changes you and your child(ren) may need to make in order to be punctual for school and miss fewer days of instruction.

We want to thank all our parents who continue to discuss the ban on sprays (perfumes/colognes) and the appropriate use of cell phones at Deer Park Public School. The majority of our students are acting respectfully and our learning environment is a safe place with a focus on learning. As a reminder, cell phones are not permitted to be used during the school day unless a teacher has given specific permission to a student. If a student feels ill and needs to call home, he/she must use the office phone. Students texting or calling their parents using their cell phones is causing issues. We have parents showing up to pick up their child when we are not even aware that a student has an issue and needs picking up. Students are encouraged to come to the office if they have any issues and we will allow them to use the school phone to call parents. This way we are kept in the loop of communication and can better ensure that our students are receiving the supports they need and they are kept safe.

Full Day Kindergarten Registration is Open!

Children who will be 4 years of age by December 31, 2017 are eligible for junior kindergarten in September of 2017, Kindergarten Registration has begun at Deer Park PS. Office hours for registration are from 8:30-12:00 and 1:05-3:30. Please bring the required documents to register your child:

- Proof of child's age (one of the following: Birth Certificate, Birth Registration, Statement of Live Birth, Passport)
- Proof of residency (one of the following: Property Tax Assessment, Proof of Purchase, Rental Agreement, Lease)


