This school year, we will continue to implement the <u>Dismantling Anti-Black Racism Strategy</u> launched in March to address anti-Black racism in schools. We also remain committed as a school board to honouring the <u>Truth and Reconciliation Commission</u> <u>Calls to Action</u>. As an education system, it is imperative that we create learning environments that enable all of our students to feel valued and to be successful.

As your school board trustee, it is my role to advocate for quality public education in York Region, and to ensure that our students remain at the centre of all of our decision making. The Board of Trustees makes <u>policy</u> and <u>budget</u> decisions, and communicates with the public, among other <u>responsibilities</u>. We are also responsible for setting direction for the school board, through our <u>Multi-Year Strategic Plan</u>. This plan sets out four priorities: Foster Well-Being and Mental Health, Build Collaborative Relationships, Champion Equity and Inclusivity, and Empower Ethical Leadership.

Orange Shirt Day September 30, 2021

Every year on September 30th, Canadians observe Gchi Piitendaagoziwag Binoojiinyag - Every Child Matters Pr $\Lambda \cup^{\circ} \subset d' \triangleleft^{\circ}$ $\Lambda \cup^{\circ} \subset d' \triangleleft^{\circ}$ Orange Shirt Day. It is a day to educate and promote awareness of Residential Schools and their lasting legacies of trauma, suffering and genocide of Indigenous People.

In July 2021, the federal government passed legislation to make this date a federal statutory holiday called the **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation**.

In 2021, First Nations independently located the unmarked graves of thousands of Indigenous children at the sites of former Residential Schools. This has sparked many Canadians to rethink what they thought they knew about these institutions and revisit the way they speak to their students about them. We encourage YRDSB staff and students to wear an orange shirt on September 30, 2021, to recognize the resiliency and bravery of Residential School Survivors and those who did not come home.

COVID-19 SCREENING REMINDERS

All staff and students must self-screen for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 **every day** before attending school. Screening **MUST** be completed **DAILY** using the <u>York Region Public Health COVID-19 School</u> <u>and Child Care Screening Tool</u>; parents and guardians must not send children to school or child care if they are showing any symptoms of COVID-19.

Step 1: Secondary students to complete on-line self-assessment <u>COVID-19 School and Child-Care</u> <u>Screening Tool</u> (please click on Check for Symptoms Daily) prior to entering the school on a daily basis.

Step 2: Upon completion of the self-assessment, complete response to the question: "Have you completed the self-screening test?" in the Confirmation <u>Form</u>.

Student receives an email response when they respond "Yes". The email will include a colour code specific to the day of the week:

MONDAY, TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY, THURSDAY, FRIDAY

Upon entering through the school designated entrances (front or attendance doors) or in the Period 1 classroom, students are to provide confirmation of completion of the self-screening by way of:

- On phone email or picture of email from their computer
- Hard copy print off of email.

This is a VERY valuable resource for all students to stay up on important dates, information, course selection, volunteer opportunities and much more!

Eligible Grade 12 students with 4 courses wanting to drop a course, can use the Drop Form posted on the Guidance Google Classroom.

This form includes the parent/guardian contact information for confirmation of the change/drop in the timetable.



Report It

Our schools should be safe, welcoming and inclusive places for everyone. It is important that students know what to do if they witness or experience inappropriate behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination.

- There may be situations when you can safely step in and intervene and help.
- Talk to an adult at school, family member or other trusted adult.
- Report the event without the person involved knowing using our online reporting tool, Report It.

Report It lets you share information about inappropriate student behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination. You can use the online form to report:

- bullying, drugs, cheating, vandalism, harassment, violence or any other inappropriate behaviour
- incidents of discrimination or hate, including anti-Indigenous racism, ableism, anti-Asian racism, anti-Black racism, antisemitism, classism, homophobia, Islamaphobia, sexism, transphobia or other forms of hate


You can report events that happen at school, at school-related events, online or off school property if it negatively affects a student or the school climate. You can also choose to make a report anonymously.

Complete reports are shared with the school to investigate and respond.

Acts of discrimination, hate and bullying are never acceptable. Using the Report It tool is a way of standing up for each other and for ourselves.
