



Daily Screening


On a daily basis, students and their parents are responsible to review and adhere to the checklist from York Region Public Health. Symptoms of Covid 19 include:

Study Hall

Description - Study hall is for:

- for students who do not have consistent access to broadband Wi-Fi at home and are in school that day for their in-person morning class
- for students who need to work on afternoon online courses while being supervised by a staff member

While in study hall, students are required to:

- sign-in for attendance and contact tracing purposes
- wear masks at all times (except when eating lunch; practice hand hygiene before /after eating)
- maintain a 2 metre distance
- sit according to an assigned seating plan only with students in your morning class; once in study hall, you cannot move to any other seat/location within study hall
- provide your own technology including earphones (preferably microphone- enabled earphones



If you need to drop someone at the school, please do so in the back parking lot (north west end of the school) to leave our bus loop open for students arriving by Board transit.







 A school council is an advisory body to the principal and where appropriate, the Board.



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




School Councils
