## **Armed Forces Co-op**

If your son or daughter is interested in a 4 credit (all day) Co-op experience that is running in semester 2, February 2019, he or she must submit an online application on the FORCES.CA website.

If accepted into this programme, your child may be placed at Base Borden in Angus, Ontario or at the John Graves Simcoe Armoury in Aurora for the semester.

Once your child has submitted that application, he or she must make contact with their assigned recruiter at: <u>32cbgrecruiting@forces.gc.ca</u> **AND come to the Co-op Office, room 305, immediately.** (Your child's timetable may have to be altered).

There are many steps to being accepted into the very challenging, but rewarding programme. Students must be at least 16 years of age, be a Canadian citizen and have at least 15 high school credits.

Students will undergo a medical test, physical fitness test, and an aptitude test. Each applicant will be provided testing dates at their local Recruiting Detachment after they have submitted their application. These dates will be arranged between the student and the recruiter (not the Co-op teacher).

Students will be required to complete an Application Package (given out by the Co-op teacher in late June/early fall); they will also need to be in possession of an official high school transcript (not report card), photo ID, proof of Canadian citizenship (Canadian birth certificate or citizenship card). As well, some students may be asked to provide an "Over 16" card that can be obtained at Service Canada.

## **Grade 9 EQAO Math Assessment**

Our Grade 9 students currently in Math classes will write the EQAO Math tests on June 12 & 13, 2018. The Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics measures how well students have met the expectations in the Grade 9 Mathematics curriculum for Applied and Academic courses. Student achievement in this assessment is reported using a four-level scale that is aligned with the scale used in The Ontario Curriculum, Grades 9 and 10: Mathematics and the Provincial Report Card, Grades 9-12, In the Ontario Curriculum. The results from this assessment provide baseline information that will assist in board and school improvement planning. Letters outlining test dates will be sent home on Friday, June 1st. The students' results on the test comprise 5% of the students' final mark in Math.
