Dear Parents/Guardians:

RE: Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test – Modified School Day November 25, 2021

The Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) has scheduled October 13 to December 1 as the *fall window* for students across the province to complete the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT). **Grade 11 and non-graduating grade 12 students in our school will be writing the test on November 25.** Grade 10 students will be writing the test in the *spring window* with details to be provided at a later date.

As with past practice, to assist in creating the best possible environment for students writing the test, and to comply with Public Health requirements and changes to the format of the test, the Board will implement a modified school day. **On November 25, all secondary schools in the North and Central regions will follow an exam-style day in which:**

- only grade 11 and non-graduating grade 12 students who are writing the test are required to be at school (no regular classes for students in grades 9, 10, and 12 will occur);
- students will be dismissed upon completion of the test;
- school bus and taxi service will run on their normal schedules; and
- self-contained special education classes [e.g., developmentally delayed, autism, complex needs, multiple exceptionalities, PEAK, York Academy programs, Intensive, Intensive Resource Support, and Acquired Brain Injury] will follow their regular schedule.

For Students Writing the OSSLT

Students writing the test will come to school on November 25 at their normal start time, **8:30 a.m.**, to write the OSSLT. Based on EQAO timelines for the test, we anticipate that many students will finish writing in about 3 hours. Students will be dismissed upon their completion of the test; however, space will be made available in the school for those who need to remain until regular dismissal time. Students requiring extra time will continue to write their test during an extended test-taking period. Modifying the school day in this way allows schools to maximize teacher supervision and support, and to ensure the availability of classroom space and access to technology.

For Students Not Writing the OSSLT

Although schools will be open, regular classes will not be running. Students not writing the test will be provided asynchronous learning activities for the day.

We wish every student success on the OSSLT and appreciate your ongoing support for student achievement and well-being.

Report It

Our schools should be safe, welcoming and inclusive places for everyone. It is important that students know what to do if they witness or experience inappropriate behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination.

- There may be situations when you can safely step in and intervene and help.
- Talk to an adult at school, family member or other trusted adult.

• Report the event without the person involved knowing using our online reporting tool, Report It.

Report It lets you share information about inappropriate student behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination. You can use the online form to report:

• bullying, drugs, cheating, vandalism, harassment, violence or any other inappropriate behaviour

• incidents of discrimination or hate, including anti-Indigenous racism, ableism, anti-Asian racism, anti-Black racism, antisemitism, classism, homophobia, Islamophobia, sexism, transphobia or other forms of hate

You can report events that happen at school, at school-related events, online or off school property if it negatively affects a student or the school climate. You can also choose to make a report anonymously.

Complete reports are shared with the school to investigate and respond.

Acts of discrimination, hate and bullying are never acceptable. Using the Report It tool is a way of standing up for each other and for ourselves.
