National Day for Truth and Reconciliation Day @Denison September 30

Denison students and staff participated in active learning and demonstrations of solidarity through the week leading up to and culminating in events during the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Through the week the morning music featured indigenous artists including the National Anthem sung in Ojibwa. The anthems were crafted by both a local band and another featured a prior Denison student.

On Wednesday, students listened to a presentation in homeroom given by Phyllis Webstad a third generation residential school survivor and the creator of Orange shirt day. In homeroom on Tuesday and/or Wednesday, students had opportunity to sign a cut-out of an orange shoe to indicate their understanding of the impact of Residential Schools on the children and their survivors. The shoes were then included in a 10m banner displayed in the front atrium.



The learning continued on Thursday as the students participated in a board wide virtual assembly facilitated by the YRDSB Indigenous Education Team in association with Indigenous community through a ceremony on Google Live Stream. Student Council also shared an exceptional slide deck that teachers could use to augment the learning from the morning in our afternoon classes.

Our learning and understanding of the impact of residential schools on the members of our community is a commitment that Denison affirms on a daily basis with our partners in education.

Report It

Our schools should be safe, welcoming and inclusive places for everyone. It is important that students know what to do if they witness or experience inappropriate behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination.

- There may be situations when you can safely step in and intervene and help.
- Talk to an adult at school, family member or other trusted adult.
- Report the event without the person involved knowing using our online reporting tool,
 Report It.

Report It lets you share information about inappropriate student behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination. You can use the online form to report:

- bullying, drugs, cheating, vandalism, harassment, violence or any other inappropriate behaviour
- incidents of discrimination or hate, including anti-Indigenous racism, ableism, anti-Asian racism, anti-Black racism, antisemitism, classism, homophobia, Islamaphobia, sexism, transphobia or other forms of hate

You can report events that happen at school, at school-related events, online or off school property if it negatively affects a student or the school climate. You can also choose to make a report anonymously.

Complete reports are shared with the school to investigate and respond.

Acts of discrimination, hate and bullying are never acceptable. Using the Report It tool is a way of standing up for each other and for ourselves.
