

Important Information for Grade 12's

During the week of October 17th all grade 12's will be receiving information in their GAPPS accounts to apply to College and University.

To qualify to apply to College (OCAS) and/or University (OUAC) students need to be on track to graduate this school year.

Additionally only students who have ENG4U1 plus five "U or M" grade 12 courses qualify to apply to University (OUAC).

Not everyone who receives a pin is eligible to apply to University (OUAC).

Grade 11 and 12 Classroom Visits

Over the last week and a half, the Guidance Department has visited all grade 11 and 12 period 1 classes. Students received an overview of the Guidance Department and how it can be used to support them. In the presentation information about the post-secondary pathways: apprenticeship, college, university and workplace and post-secondary prerequisites was also shared. Throughout the school year, additional information will be shared through My Pathways Planner, myBlueprint software. All students are part of a grade specific Google Classroom. When new information is shared, students receive an email in their YRDSB GAPPS account.

From there, enter in your email address and leave the password blank, to set up a one-time access link, or to reset a password that you've created. An email will be sent with a time-limited link that will look similar to this:

Report It

Our schools should be safe, welcoming and inclusive places for everyone. It is important that students know what to do if they witness or experience inappropriate behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination.

- There may be situations when you can safely step in and intervene and help.
- Talk to an adult at school, family member or other trusted adult.
- Report the event without the person involved knowing using our online reporting tool, Report It.

Report It lets you share information about inappropriate student behaviour or incidents of hate or discrimination. You can use the online form to report:

- bullying, drugs, cheating, vandalism, harassment, violence or any other inappropriate behaviour
- incidents of discrimination or hate, including anti-Indigenous racism, ableism, anti-Asian racism, anti-Black racism, antisemitism, classism, homophobia, Islamaphobia, sexism, transphobia or other forms of hate

You can report events that happen at school, at school-related events, online or off school property if it negatively affects a student or the school climate. You can also choose to make a report anonymously.

Complete reports are shared with the school to investigate and respond.

Acts of discrimination, hate and bullying are never acceptable. Using the Report It tool is a way of standing up for each other and for ourselves.
