Study Hall

Our supervised lunch and Study Hall will commence on Monday, September 21st in the cafeteria. The purpose of Study Hall is to provide a space for students who do not have consistent access to broadband Wi-Fi at home and are in school that day for their in-person morning class. During both the lunch period (for those remaining for Study Hall) and Study Hall itself, students will not have in-person access to their own classroom teachers.

Students who need to stay will move directly from their Block 1 class to Study Hall. Students must be working on afternoon online courses while being supervised by a staff member. Students will be supervised to ensure safety and will focus on participants' adherence to all Public Health requirements including sitting 2-meters apart.

During Study Hall, students must be respectful of the learning needs of all participants engaging in online classes. Students should use earphones and an appropriate volume while focusing on their learning.

While in Study Hall, students will:

- •wear masks at all times (except when eating lunch; practice hand hygiene before/after eating)
- •maintain a 2-meter distance
- •sit in proximity with those students from their morning class (if any) for Lunch and Study Hall
- •sign in for attendance purposes and remain in assigned seat
- •provide their own technology including earphones (preferably microphone-enabled earphones to reduce noise during interactive activities with the online class)
- •bring their lunches and maintain a clean and healthy environment; there will be no food service in the cafeteria and student are not permitted to leave property
- •recycle and clean their work space; food delivery services are not permitted
- •follow all expectations for Study Hall to ensure that health and safety (COVID-19) guidelines are adhered to (use the appropriate doors, sit in their designated seat)

The International and Indigenous Languages (IIL) program provides elementary and secondary students with the opportunity to speak, read and write a new language or maintain heritage language and culture. Due to the pandemic, International and Indigenous Language classes for grades 9 to 12 students will take place **online**, not in the school buildings. Teachers will teach live language lessons in real time using Google Classroom to provide both synchronous and asynchronous learning opportunities during the regularly scheduled language class.
