### Student Report

#### Teacher Report

Itty Bitty Free Store: The teachers are working on having classes participate as part of projects, the store will run all year long and will give opportunities to exchange various items for free. There was talk about having it open during parent-teacher night. The opening date is October 24 in the former Student Council Room in the cafeteria.

**Breakfast Program:** Room 153 every day from 8 to 8:30 am. Everyone is welcome. This program is funded through grants and all students are welcome.

Food Pantry: This program is coming soon.
Delivery of food is expected on October 19, 2022.
The organizer is exploring and finding interest within the school community about what types of food they should be buying. The students can take items home, this program is also run with a government grant and if the money runs out the parent council could support it.

Student success has a good food program for those who may need food at different times in a more discrete manner.

A question arose about when the cafeteria will start to operate again. The principal stated sometime soon as the equipment needs to be ready and there is a need for staff to run it. Cafeteria staff found

	other jobs during the pandemic and the school is working on having it open again. Can we bring food trucks during lunch? No due to challenges around the accountability of owners regarding meeting YRDSB safety measurements and documentation requirements.
