# LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Day	Materials	Explanation
1 Morning Entry	Sticky notes, writing tool	Students enter the classroom and the first desk is looking for notes in a sticky note or if no desk is free!
2 Jan Breakers	Handprint Presentation, Handouts, Who is my teacher? Handout	Get to know the teacher Handprint - Distribute a hand 5/10 page PT Handout and personally study the handout. Distribute the "Who is my teacher" and distribute a sticky note for the activity.
3 class 2 groups	Jan Jan Jan, Student cards, & self-stickie for students	With an in-class activity and group explanation, the students to be given student cards which will be explained later.

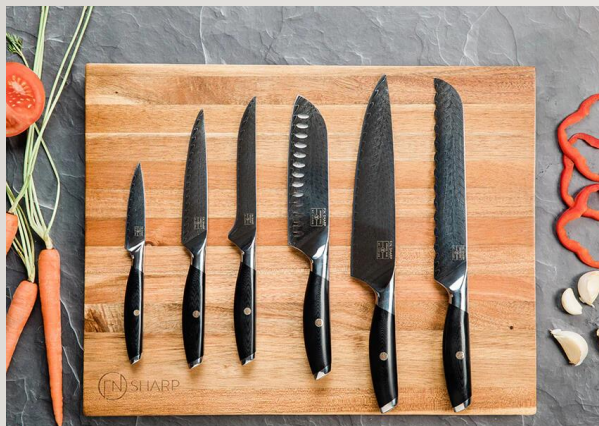

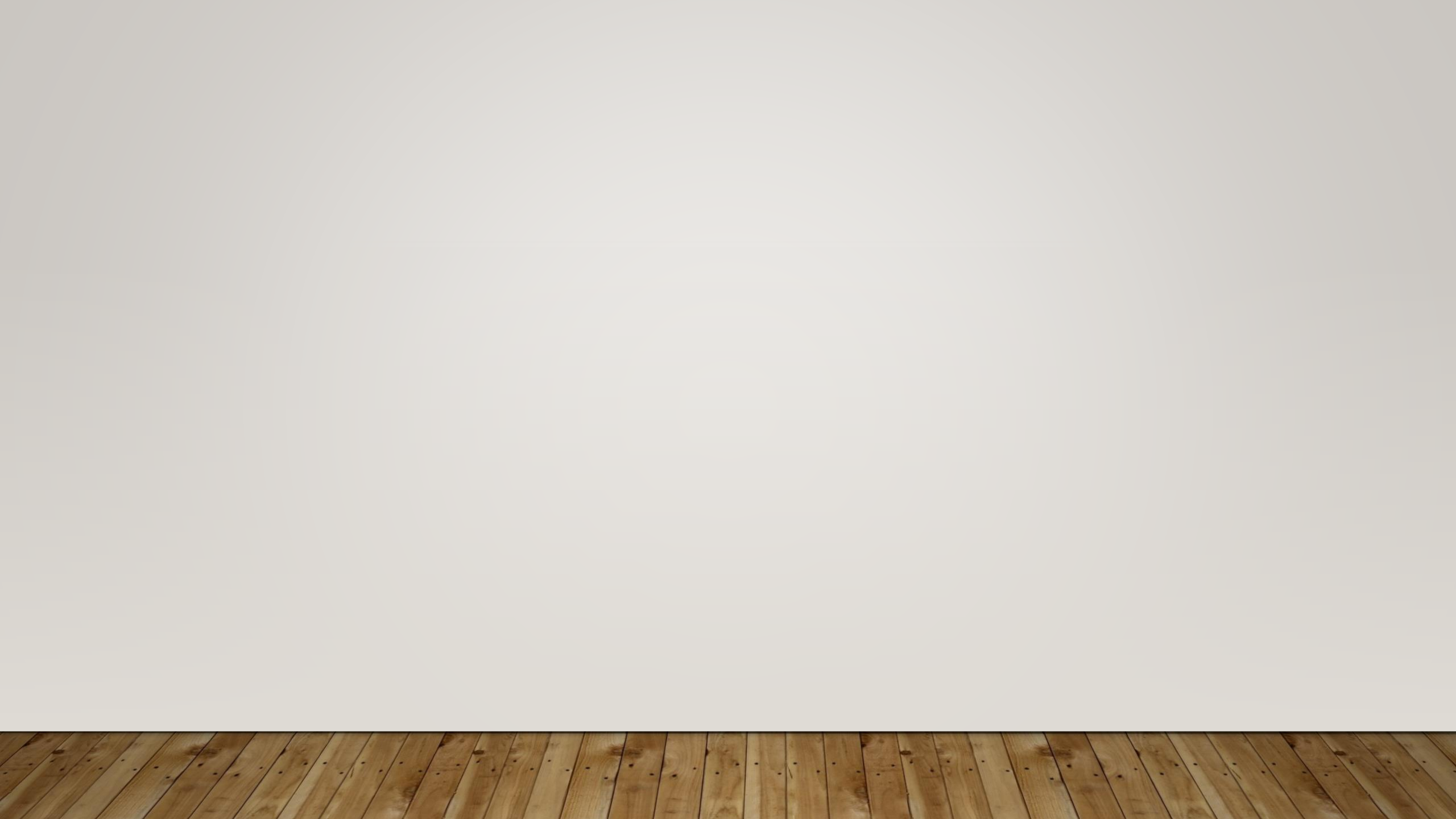

Your involvement in the council gives you the opportunity to strengthen that partnership, and to be part of a dedicated team working to support a high quality of education and an accountable education system for the children of Ontario. # WHAT IS THE ROLE OF THE COUNCIL?

School councils are advisory bodies which may make recommendations to the school principal or to the Board on matters as stated in all applicable Board policies and procedures. School councils are comprised of:

- a) parents/guardians (constituting the majority of members of the school council);
- b) students;
- c) at least one community representative;
- d) the school principal;
- e) one teaching staff member; and
- f) one support staff member.




## 2.7 School councils are responsible for:

- reviewing school data as an input into school council activities to co-create solutions and to be responsive to the needs of the student and school community;
- sharing lived experiences to foster an understanding of community needs and to work towards achieving shared objectives;
- supporting and promoting family and community engagement in advancing student achievement and well-being and mental health in an equitable and inclusive manner;
- collaborating together as a school council, not as individual school council members, to make recommendations to the Board in the development and implementation of the school improvement plan;
- communicating with and providing ongoing advice to the principal on school-related matters;
- collaborating with the principal to coordinate community resources that support student learning, achievement and well-being and mental health;
- understanding and communicating with members of the community about the roles and responsibilities of school councils as outlined in the School Councils policy and procedure and appropriate guidelines and legislation, as required; and
- working with the school principal to reconcile the impact/influence/value that the school council activities have on student success and school improvement



# #3 - WHO SITS ON THE COUNCIL?

---

- Councils are comprised of parents, the principal, one teacher, one admin/support staff , at least one community rep and a student (where appropriate).
    - ~~Elementary - 9 members, at least 5 parents~~
    - Secondary - 11 members, at least 6 parents
  - Members are elected annually in September.

# #4 ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

---

- **Chair/Co-Chair:** Calls & chairs meetings; sets agendas works collaboratively with members to assign duties
- **Vice-Chair:** Supports and assists the Chair
- **Treasurer:** Manages finances, reports monthly on accounts
- **Secretary:** Prepares agendas and minutes
- **Members:** Participate and encourage participation
